Journal Granted Privilege.

Dr. F. O. Norris circulated a petition here last week, which was signed by more than a hundred citizens, urging the city council to withdraw the fire limit ordinance so as to allow the Santa Fe railroad to erect a wooden depot on the lots which were recently vacated by the McClanahan Lumber company. According to the ordinance no improvements can be made within the fire limits except they be of a fire-proof class. The proposed depot site extends sixteen feet within the fire limit line. The city council, with Mayor Reister in the chair, met in special session last Monday night to consider the petition. The council got right down to business and the session lasted only a short while. The council did not withdraw the fire limit, as petitioned, but it exempted the Santa Fe railroad from the fire limit in this instance, which is practically the same thing as far as building the depot is concerned. No doubt, since this trouble of some months has been decided in favor of the Santa Fe will begin the erection of the depot right away.
