Columbus, Texas, April 11.

In the probate court the annual account of Robertson and Byars, administrators of the Dunovon estate, was approved, showing the receipt of over \$300,000 during the year, nearly all of which was disbursed to the secured creditors and on costs of administration.

In the matter of the guardianship of the children of the late E. J. Sandmeyer, Earl S. Sandmeyer was appointed guardian for three of the children to succeed Mrs. M. Sandmeyer, deceased, and was instructed to make a bond of \$40,000.

The will of Mrs. M. Sandmeyer has been filed for probate and will be acted upon at this term of the court. In the will her nephew, Charles Kunze, is named to be sole executor to act without bond. In the application for letters testamentary the estate is valued at \$70,000. Charles Kunze is to have the use and benefits of the Sandmeyer farm, near town, during his life time and is given outright \$2000 in cash and a house and two lots in Columbus. The remainder of her estate is to be divided equally among her grand children, Julius F. Sandmeyer, Earl S. Sandmeyer, Nellie Sandmeyer, Genevieve Sandmeyer, Loraine Sandmeyer and Ida Virginia Sandmeyer.

She is the daughter of Mrs. W. T. Eldridge of San Antonio, the sister of Mr. J. W. Gordon our fellow townsman and the granddaughter of Mrs. Fannie A.
