On next Thursday Judge Camp

of the 45th district court will

pass upon the application of the

receiver of the Ellis sugar planta-

tion to sell the property. If fa-

vorable action is taken June 4th

will be fixed as the date of the

sale, which will be by auction

and to the highest bidder. The

receiver is John C. Sullivan, a

well known young attorney of

this city, who was appointed by

the court. He holds the prop-

erty to be worth \$350,000. He

owns the valuation of the land

at \$200,000 and the improvements

at \$150,000. The plantation con-

sists of 400 acres in cultivation,

which has now upon it a fine crop

of growing cane.

This is one of the finest planta-

tions of its kind in the world, and

there is expected to be a spirited

lot of bidders if the sale should

be ordered.

All first mortgage liens against

the property, amounting to nearly

\$150,000, have been secured by

purchase by W. T. Eldridge

of this city. On March 28th he

took up first mortgage liens to

the amount of \$124,000, held by

Dr. Amos Graves, Sr., and \$15,000

held by H. Masterson. This

gives Mr. Eldridge control of all

secured claims against the es-

tate. He will probably be one of

the bidders for the estate when

it is ordered sold.

There are outstanding claims

which are unsecured to the

amount of \$50,000. If the sale

of the estate should bring more

than the amount of the first mort-

gage liens, \$150,000, held by Mr.

Eldridge, such surplus would be

used to pay off the unsecured

claims.

The city council of Seguin has passed on the Tröbel proposition on the electric light question, and have issued \$50,000 of bonds to pay for same. Seguin now owns her electric light and power system. The income per annum

from the plant in the neighborhood of \$10,000 and is increasing rapidly. The city will at once improve and enlarge the river power and add more dynamos. To do this they will spend \$10,000 in the next few months and then the plant will be capable of taking care of a population of 30,000. Seguin is now in the

power on both sides of the river and owns her own lights and waterworks, a matter of \$200,000. Seguin Enterprise.
