### The Modern Hebrew.

There is no more wonderful  
element in human history than  
the stream of Hebrew life, that  
for centuries has flowed in broken  
and storm-tossed passage, but  
always as a distinct entity through  
the world. Hebrews are still a  
strongly individualized race.

They have not merged into the  
nations with which they have  
mingled. They are as distinct  
now as they were four or six  
thousand years ago.

They are as influential as  
people today, less, more influential  
than when they were not broken  
and scattered. Now they affect  
the world, then they touched  
only their neighbors.

Their genius for getting wealth,  
for one thing, gives them power.  
The money markets of the world  
are more in their hands than we  
are aware. The capitals of Europe,  
notably those of the German em-  
pire, are dominated by Jewish  
banks and capital. The sinews  
of war are furnished to European  
governments and armies by these  
same houses. War is made and  
peace is made often only at their  
dictation. In our own land the  
same financial success of the  
Hebrew is too patent to need re-  
mark. In Texas, there is hardly a  
thriving town or city in which  
Jewish names are not prominent,  
if not actually dominant, in cir-  
cles of trade.

Furthermore, it is not merely  
wealth-getting, that makes the  
Jew powerful, it is his ability of  
other kinds. He possesses marked  
legal ability. The leading lawyer  
of Louisville is a Jew; several  
leading attorneys in Cincinnati  
are Jews—not to mention the  
mayor of that city; and the Jewish  
graduates of Columbia university  
are flocking to the bar of New  
York city, and gaining the  
lead at it. They have scientific  
ability; their people are taking  
place in the faculties of this coun-  
try and Europe; while in Ger-  
many, especially in Berlin, the  
leading physicians are nearly all  
of Jewish blood. They have lit-  
erary ability, their writers are  
gaining reputations. I. Zang-  
will is not alone in Hebrew let-  
ters. Their rabbis are cultivated  
men, often speak several lan-  
guages, and almost invariably  
are public speakers of polish and  
refinement.

The Jews are a wonderful peo-  
ple. Few peoples could have  
withstood the persecutions they  
used to bear and yet many of  
their best traits came, no doubt,  
from persecution. Their names  
are the result of extortion; for  
when, in the middle ages it be-  
came necessary for each person  
to possess a second name, and  
when the Jews applied to the  
authorities for theirs, they were  
charged outrageous sums for  
registration; and half in jest,  
half in reparation, they were as-  
signed beautiful names such as  
"Goldstein, or Golden stone;  
Rosenberg, Rosy Mountain; Ros-  
enkrantz, Wreath of Roses; Ros-  
enthal, Valley of Roses, Blumen-  
thal, Valley of Flowers," and the  
like. —San Antonio Light.
