Six amendments to the State constitution will be voted upon by the people of Texas the first Tuesday in August. The first on the list will be a proposition to fix the salary of members of the legislature at a sum not to exceed \$1,000 per year, with \$5 per day for any special session, and mileage going and coming to Austin at the rate of 3 cents per mile. The second amendment provides for the establishment of a home for Confederate widows. The third authorizes the establishment of a State printing plant. The fourth amendment creates the office of commissioner of agriculture. The fifth provides for the creation of improvement districts in certain cities. The sixth amendment authorizes the levy of a road and bridge tax not to exceed 30c on the \$100 valuation of property and the issuance of bonds for said purposes. It would be well to secure a copy of these proposed amendments, that each and every voter may understand and vote intelligently upon same at the August election. Weimar Mercury.

Bryan on "Bryanism."

William Jennings Bryan's defence, in Brooklyn, of what shallow scoundrels like to call "Bryanism" was one of his happiest efforts.

The body of principles which he has so forcefully and so eloquently advocated from the rostrum and in the press has for more than a century been the essence of the Democratic creed, which holds that all men are created with equal rights if not with equal opportunities, that the equal rights of all shall be preserved and special privileges be granted to none, that the agent at Washington is the creature of the constitution, and that it must not invade the rights which the States reserved to themselves when they ratified the Constitution.

These principles lived before Bryan and they will outlive Bryan as long as popular government lives in the world. They lived in this country long before Thomas Jefferson and the makers of the Constitution formulated them into a code which the simplest citizen can read as he reads.

They are principles for which the great majority of the American people, without respect to party, are ready to fight, if necessary, as Nathaniel Bacon fought for them in Virginia in the first revolt against British tyranny, one hundred years before the Declaration of Independence was written.

What they call "Bryanism" made Abraham Lincoln one of the three greatest Presidents this country has had. By borrowing from it here and there, President Roosevelt has accomplished nearly everything which, for a time, made him one of the most popular of all the Presidents.

It is a robbery of the fame of Washington, Jefferson and Lincoln to try to impute to Bryan a copyright of "Bryanism." That he has been foremost among the Democrats during the last decade and more is due simply to his thorough saturation with the only safe principles of American government, and to his fearless and unflinching advocacy of them. Cotton Seed Products.

It is interesting to note that several of the largest farmers and stockmen are using cotton seed meal exclusively in connection with hulls in feeding their cattle, horses, mules and hogs. J. J. Wheeler says that his horses eat the meal and do well on it. He has instructed his overseer, Mr. Napier, to begin educating his mules in the fall to begin eating the meal and hulls. He hopes in this way to eventually be able to "cut down his" corn crop and put the same ground in cotton, put the money for the hull in his pocket and feed the meal and hulls to his cattle, horses and hogs. Mr. John Sheppard has fed his horses for several years on meal and hulls and is very much pleased with it as a food. J. Q. Adams, of Cordele, has also had considerable experience in feeding hogs on this material, and his experience is that it fattens and grows of young pigs quicker than any feed with which he is familiar. 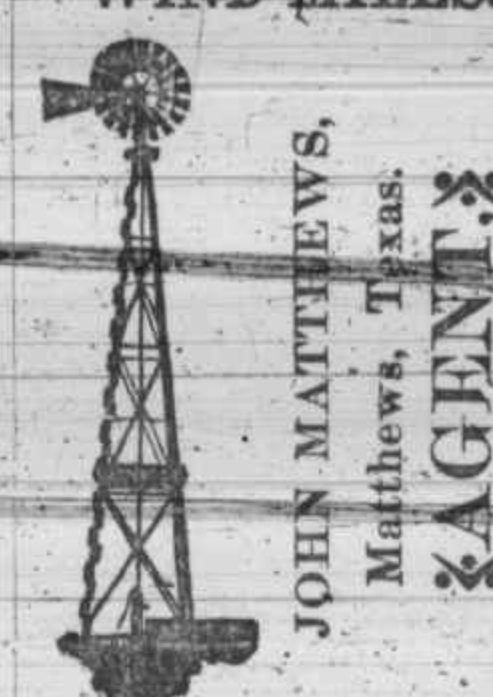
