Mattresses.

When mattresses are stained, make a paste by mixing starch with cold water. Spread the paste on the stains, first putting the mattress in the sun. In an hour or two brush off the starch, and if the stain has not disappeared repeat the process, says Home Notes. It is a good plan to cover mattresses with cases of unbleached calico, and keep the mattress clean a very long time.
