Colorado on a Rampage.

The Colorado river is on a rampage owing to the heavy rains of this week. The Alleyton bottom has been a regular sea. The crops on the lower river bottoms have been flooded and ruined. At the hour of closing our forms, at noon yesterday, the river had reached a height of 38 feet and was on a stand still at Columbus, and the water was red, showing that the waters from Austin had reached that point. At eleven o'clock yesterday morning the water was just at the top of the Faber Planting Company's levees, and a force of 200 men was sand-bagging the levees. Up to that hour no material damage had resulted in that vicinity from the high water.

News was brought to town noon, yesterday that the river was breaking over at the mouth of Old Caney in the Thatcher field.
