Five Men Were Indicted.

Five men were indicted by the grand jury at San Antonio for the Coleman murder. The grand jury returned true bills against Marion Hope, Frank Maibaum, J. W. Kincheloe, Will Clements and George Shoaf. All are released on bail. Marion Hope, one of the men arrested, was released in the sum of \$10,000, while the four other men, Frank Maibaum, J. W. Kincheloe, Will Clements and George Shoaf, were released in the sum of \$5000 each on the charge of conspiracy to murder. The habeas corpus proceedings were held Wednesday morning immediately following the arrests, and a number of wealthy men were present from out of the city ready to sign up for them. There are some twelve to fifteen signatures to the different bonds growing out of this case.

The indictments grew out of the killing of James Coleman in the Iron Front saloon at San Antonio three weeks ago. The evidence submitted to the grand jury was, for the most part, the written testimony of the witnesses at the inquest proceedings.
