## Spotless Linen.

The following recipe for the washing mixture will insure clothes being beautifully clean and white without a great amount of rubbing.

Get two pounds of common soda, one gill of sweet oil, one gill of turpentine, one pint of ammonia. Dissolve the soda and pour into a two-gallon bottle, add the sweet oil and turpentine and lastly the ammonia.

Since we together then fill the bottle nearly full with cold water; shake again and it is ready for use.

One gill of this mixture put into the boiler when the clothes are boiling will surprise anyone who has not tried it before. It leaves no smell, is economical and does no injury to the clothes.
