Oldest Orchard in America.

The oldest apple orchard in America, if not in the world, is in the center of the ancient town of Manzano, eighteen miles southwest of Estancia, Terrance county, New Mexico. Many of the trees are more than six feet in circumference, but all are in fruitful and vigorous condition, although neglected for generations. Little is known of the history of this orchard, but the oldest inhabitants of the valley of the Rio Grande, remember the orchard from childhood and say that the trees have not changed in appearance since then. Venerable Mexicans and Pueblo Indians tell of visiting the orchard as far back as they can remember and finding apples on the ground in all stages of decomposition at least two feet deep.

The Estancia valley has been peopled for ages, probably by the kinsmen of the natives found by the Spanish explorers at Cran Quivira, Labo and other ancient cities. Probably in the early days of the Spanish occupation some Franciscan monk found his way to Manzano and there planted the seeds that have developed into these venerable trees. They are no doubt fully three hundred years old.

Close by the orchard is a little lake fed by a large spring. A short distance away is a grove of pines and cedars, making an ideal place for picnic and camping places. —World.

A Thorough Clean-Up.

"It is the most thorough clean-up both in Louisiana and Texas that I have ever known since I have been connected with the rice business," says Hiram W. Carver of Houston, who is here for a few days. "There is no rice left in first hands in Texas, so far as I know, and the same seems to be true of Louisiana."

Mr. Carver was asked to explain the clean-up, which seems to have surprised many rice men. "I do not see that there is anything remarkable," was the cautious reply. "Not all the rice has been looked for a carry-over. We have not feared a surplus at any time, and the present condition of the market is such that consumption of rice has reached such proportions that a few do not cut the figure they used to."

"I look for an increase of twelve to fifteen per cent over last year, both in Louisiana and Texas. An increase of twenty to twenty-five per cent could not hurt us. The outlook appears good to me." —Crowley Signal.

Care of Catalogs.

Do not the dear people yet know and realize that it is a great crime to mutilate a mail order catalog? It should occupy a place with the family album on the center table in the parlor. It should be approached with veneration and awe. Dust should not be allowed to mar it, nor thieves to break in and steal it.

The correct way to preserve a catalog is to buy a beveled edge, French plate-glass box, secured at the corners with brass or nickel fastenings. It should be provided with a strong lock. After this receptacle has been obtained the catalog should be placed very carefully on the velvet within which the box is made.
