THREE STRAIGHT GAMES.

The O. K.'s of Houston Lost Three Games to the Eagle Lake Team.

The O. K. baseball team of Houston came up Tuesday morning for a series of games with the local team. That the boys from the city were confident of victory is evidenced by the following from the Houston Post: The O. K. boys leave this morning for Eagle Lake to play a series of games with the team in that city Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. The two victories to their credit.

Evidently the games did not result as the Houston boys expected and they returned home Thursday night a sadder but wiser bunch—having lost three straight games and suffering one shut-out. Very small crowds attended the games and the home team came out \$14 to the bad.

From the very first inning in Tuesday's game, in which inning Eagle Lake scored 5 runs, it was easily seen that the visitors were out-classed. Grabowski was hit hard all over the field. Scurry Peebles was on the firing line for the locals and pitched a shut-out game, allowing the visitors only one scratch hit. The final score was 8 to 0 in favor of Eagle Lake.

Wednesday's game was a regular slugging match. "Boots" Walker pitched for the locals and Hoffman for the visitors. Both pitchers were tapped quite lively and errors were many by both sides. The game resulted in another victory for Eagle Lake by a score of 14 to 7.

The third and last game of the series played Thursday was also won by Eagle Lake, making three straight games. This was a little improvement over the game of day previous, but still it was a slow and uninteresting exhibition of ball playing. Stelzig for Houston and "Babe" Peebles for Eagle Lake, two left-handed men, were in the box and both were thumped for a full share of hits. The score, 8 to 5.

Mr. Abe Beales who has been the manager for the local team has tendered his resignation and W. C. Sanders has been elected to that position with John Guynn as assistant.

A series of three games has been arranged with Luling to be played here on the 22nd, 23rd and 24th. Luling has one of the best amateur teams in the state and will be among the best, if not the best, that will be played here this season and they should be attended by large crowds.

The local bunch is today trying to arrange games by telephone with Yokum, Gonzales and Lockhart, and should the arrangements be completed, the Eagle Lake team will leave tonight for a nine days' trip.
