ON AND after July 12th the barber who ties you back in a chair with a towel that has done the same service for customers before you without having interviewed the laundryman will be subject to a heavy penalty. He must keep his shop and all his paraphernalia in a thoroughly sanitary condition and in addition to this he must stand an examination and secure a permit, and pay a license of \$1 per year, and he must display his certificate in front of his chair in a conspicuous place. It will not be necessary for the barbers who have been working as journeymen in this State for more than two years to stand the examination, but all will have to secure the certificate and pay the fee of \$1. Apprentices having worked two years at the business may stand the examination. The union requires that apprentices work three years, but it is stated that this will not interfere, for the reason that an apprentice is granted an apprentice card and after standing the examination he can continue under that card until he is eligible under the union to a journeyman's card. Hallettsville Herald.

The barber law is in harmony with the trend of most of our recent legislation, and if this trend continues it will be impossible for a man to make a living at any pursuit without first having secured and paid for the permission of somebody at Austin. As yet no valid reason whatever has been given for this act. It will not inure to the benefit of the public; indeed, it may be detrimental to the interests of the public. The board authorized to license barbers will be made up of members of the craft who will find ways to exclude outsiders and to limit the number of barbers for the purpose of raising prices. It is simply a measure in restraint of trade, to help along a combination to raise prices, passed by a body that professed great horror of monopoly. O. democracy, democracy, what a deceit is being perpetrated in thy name!—Galveston News.
