

Camp Delight, Comal County, Texas, Aug. 15.—Practically all of the professors of the Southwest Normal School at San Marcos, with their wives and families, who are spending several weeks at Camp Delight,

stayed up until a o'clock this morning to view the comet which appears in the early morning hours. The comet was visible to the entire party and presented a beautiful spectacle in the sky. Speaking of the comet Prof. C. W. Standfield of the Department of Biology of the Southwest Normal said today: "A man of Houston asserts that the comet is merely a group of stars. I suppose he mistakes the group of stars for the comet. The comet is a group of stars, which he refers to. Not being a scientist, he could easily make this mistake. This is the only half naked eye group in that part of the heaven. Others have mislocated the comet by speaking of its being near the belt of Orion. I observed the comet carefully from 4 o'clock until 6 o'clock this morning, and find it twelve or thirteen degrees east of Orion and one and one-half degrees west of the star Gamma Geminorum. This star is about one-third the distance from Orion to Castor and Pollux, the two brightest stars of the Gemini. It is a fine object in the morning skies, having an apparent magnitude of a third magnitude star. Its tail is perfectly distinct to the naked eye, extending towards the southwest or towards the Sun. The tail seems to be from nine to ten degrees in length.
