An Experiment in Cotton

An experiment in cotton growing is being watched with interest by the entomologists of the state as well as by a large number of farmers who have not reached their ideal in the economical production of a crop. The process is only regarded as an experiment by those who are watching the results.

For the farmer, O. P. Walcott of Dallas County, regards the plan as successful. It consists of planting the seed in check rows so it can be plowed in several different directions. This eliminates the chopping of the cotton to a stand, and also the necessity of rescuing the crop from the weeds with a hoe.

Mr. Walcott is effectually destroying a crop of Johnson grass by the system, and, in addition, by the constant agitation of the plant, is interfering with the operations of the weevil to such an extent that they have been practically driven from the field, while other crops in his vicinity, planted with the old fashioned drill, are literally alive with them.

Mr. Walcott lays great stress in the economical feature of raising cotton by his method, and claims that the boys and girls on the farms may by this system be emancipated from much labor, which has in the past been detrimental to their educational advantages.

It is a well known fact that frequent agitation of the plant, either by plowing or hoeing, is very destructive to the weevil, and the Dallas experiment has several features that commend it to the careful attention of the cotton growing districts, not only in Texas, but through the entire South, and the educational interests of the rising generation is not the least of them.—San Antonio Express.
