Eagle Lake Deserves and Must Have a Creamery.

Fertilizer Pays. Commissioner Katman said to the Star man yesterday that fertilizer applied to the land on the poor farm paid a profit of \$8 per acre. The county has twelve acres of cotton, on a part of which fertilizer had been used. From this tract five bales have been gathered and there is yet one to gather. The record was carefully kept of the product, and it is found that the portion fertilized made \$10 worth of cotton more per acre than did the other. The cost of the fertilizer was \$2 per acre. A net profit of \$8 per acre is not bad for the use of the fertilizer. —Chero Star.
