### THE METHODIST CHURCH.

One of the oldest institutions of Eagle Lake is the Methodist Church. The Methodist Circuit Rider began to visit this part of the State, and preach in the homes of the people before there was an Eagle Lake. At present they do not have the service of a preacher every Sunday; but on the first and third Sundays in each month. It is thought that the Church will soon take a forward step, and have a pastor for his full time. Prayer-Meeting is held every Wednesday night. In this service all the members and especially the Official Board are expected to unite their prayers for the Spiritual welfare of the town; and for the salvation of sinners.

### THE SUNDAY SCHOOL.

The Sunday School is recognized as the leading factor in Church work. Mr. E. S. Winfree is the faithful and efficient Superintendent, always on hand and ready for every good word and work. Every member of the Church should give him their active co-operation.

### WOMAN'S HOME MISSION SOCIETY.

What would the Church do without her faithful women? Our

Woman's Home Mission Society, under the guidance of Mrs. M. C. Yates, has been prominent in every move for the good of the Church and the town. One of the works of these "Elect Women" is to see that the Preacher and his family have a comfortable home in which to live. This house is furnished him free of rent. This means much to the Preacher and to the cause he represents; but it means vastly more than most people can imagine to the faithful woman, who gives up all hope of having a home of her own, and follows the Preacher from one side of the State to the other, to help and cheer him in his work. But the work of the good woman does not stop here. Much of the spiritual life of the Church is due to their earnest prayers for their husbands, brothers and sons.

The popular pastor of the Methodist Church is Bro. J. E. Morgan. He is a fine preacher and he is a conscientious Christian gentleman. Bro. Morgan enjoys the respect and esteem of not only his church, but the whole of Eagle Lake.

### MR. T. W. DAVIS.

Mr. Davis was born in Noxubee county, Mississippi, in 1847, and came to Texas in 1867, locating in Matagorda county in 1868, and came to Eagle Lake in 1880. Mr. Davis enlisted in the

with Gen. Pemberton at the siege of Vicksburg, after which he was with Gen. Joe Johnston on his campaign through Georgia. Mr. Davis was captured by the enemy while on Gen. Hood's raid into Tennessee, and was held a prisoner of war in Camp Chase in Ohio for eight months. He was also captured at the Battle of Corinth, but escaped by night and walked fifty miles back to his command. Mr. Davis was elected Public Weigher in 1894, and is still filling that office. He has formerly served as school trustee and has also been a member of the board of aldermen.

COTTON is bringing a good price this fall. The man is happy who plowed late and thereby made a good crop.

Mr. J. E. Carney, who lives about six miles from Eagle Lake, was in to see us during the last part of August, and informed us that he was ready to thresh his rice. Mr. Carney has

since threshed, and his yield was in the neighborhood of seventeen sacks to the acre. Mr. Carney moved to this section on the 20th of last September from Kansas, and this is his first attempt at raising rice. The average yield is between twelve and fourteen bags to the acre.

Canned sweet potatoes have become a very popular food, but for some reason the canning idea hasn't struck the people of this section, for we ship them out of the state, where they are put up in cans, then we pay the freight again to have them shipped back into the state for eating purposes, giving a dozen men a profit before they are a marketable product. Colorado county raises as fine potatoes as can be found on earth, but we have never yet begun to can them.

Dr. Bruce has in his garden seven orange trees of the Satsuma variety. They were set out year before last. Last year they bore five or six splendid oranges, and this year there are several dozens on the trees. The doctor has also a banana tree bearing fruit. Mr. E. P. Newsom last year had a banana tree that bore luxuriantly. The growing of semi-tropical fruits has never been tried on a large scale, but the above shows that it can be carried to a point where it would be of commercial value.
