BANK SUSPENDED.

Vineyard, Walker & Company Bank Closed Its Doors Yesterday.

Vineyard, Walker & Co., bankers, filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy in the Federal Court in Houston Friday morning. Mr. B. L. Vineyard and Mr. A. M. Waugh state that the assets of the bank will exceed the liabilities by \$100,000.00, and that it was necessary for the firm to take this step because of its inability under present conditions to realize cash on securities held by the bank. The deposits of the bank in round figures are about \$170,000.00; bills receivable about \$250,000.00; overdrafts due the bank about \$62,000.00 (some of this is secured and practically all good); debts due other banks, secured, about \$60,000.00. Up to

the time of going to press the Court had not yet named the receiver. The above figures are approximated, the exact figures can not be given out before tonight or probably Monday. The Vineyard, Walker & Co. Bank is the oldest banking institution in the city, and the closing of its doors on account of the depressed money market is regretted by every person in Eagle Lake. The HEADLIGHT, in common with most every person in the city, believes it is only a temporary suspension and that the bank will pay out dollar for dollar. Everything possible was

done by the bank to obtain money from the money centers before it took the steps that it did. Expressions of deepest regret for this bank and expressions of implicit confidence in all who are connected with it is all that has been heard on the streets today. Rev.
