The stockholders of the Sealy Mattress Company held their annual meeting in Houston Thurs-

day. This is one of the largest and most prominent manufacturing plants in the South. The "Sealy mattress," being one of the products of cotton, famed the country over. The stockholders elected the following directory for the ensuing year: Jonathan Lane, J. F. Walters, P. F. Pritch-

ard, vice-president; T. J. Underwood, secretary-treasurer and general manager. The company has a large factory in Dallas, and some time ago bought a valuable factory site on the bayou in Houston on which the building of a factory is contemplated in the future.

More than 700 box stalls will be required to accommodate all the thoroughbreds booked to race at the San Antonio Fair this year, from Nov. 9 to 24. Not in the history of Texas race tracks has there been so brilliant a prospect for splendid racing. Approximately \$30,000 will be distributed in purses for the regular events on the program, which does not include the one or two extra races to be added daily on the program. There are now on the grounds more than two hundred horses, which have been working for the last month in anticipation of the opening meeting. Practically every State in the Union which boasts of thoroughbreds will have representations at the Fair. For months the committee in charge of this feature of the Fair has been booking the thoroughbreds to appear here.
