Some of the banks which suspended during the recent financial crisis, those that private banks have resumed business, those other classes of banks. Although the private banks of the state are few in number, more private banks suspended than State and National banks together. All the State banks and all the National Banks, except one, which suspended have resumed business and were apparently not impaired by the financial situation. At the last legislature a law was proposed providing for state inspection of private banks. The law did not pass but conditions have brought a sentiment in favor of placing private banks under state inspection. It was urged particularly at the last session that private banks, which have the care of public funds, should be under the supervision of the state. The following is a list of banks which suspended during the last few months:

State Banks—The West Texas Bank and Trust Company of San Antonio and the Johnson City State Bank of Johnson City.

National Banks—The Woods National Bank of San Antonio and the First National Bank of Eagle Lake.

Private Banks—T. W. House & Co. of Houston; Vineyard, Walker & Co. of Eagle Lake; Murphy, Walker & Co. of Marfa; Ward County Bank of Barstow and the Harris Savings Bank of Tyler.

Both State banks have resumed and the First National Bank of Eagle Lake has resumed. One National Bank and all five private banks are still suspended.

SHOT AND KILLED.

Tabloquah (Okla.) Arrow.

Monday night at his home in North Tabloquah "Dode" West was shot and instantly killed. One shot entered the right side of the head about an inch from the eye and came out on the left side of the neck. The other entered at the top and back of the head and taking a downward course lodged in the body. Either wound would have produced in itself death. Dave Hartness was arrested charged with the crime.

The crime was committed by Wm. Book about 8 o'clock Tuesday morning when he went to the home of West to see him on some business matters. On opening the door the body of the murdered man was found lying on the floor with one foot in the air. The man's face being burned off and several toes burned to a crisp. The shoe being gone the alarm and an investigation was started by the officers. At the request which was held Tuesday afternoon by Justice M. O. Ghormley, the evidence went to show that on Monday evening Hartness went to the home of West to buy a bale of hay which he refused to sell, but proposed instead a game of craps to decide whether flatness should have the hay or not. The game started and during its progress West's son, a young man about 19 years old came in and getting a fiddle told his father he was going to a dance in the neighborhood. That was the last seen of him alive by any one except Hartness. But about 2 o'clock in the morning a young boy by the name of John Whitmore, whose mother was ill, called at the house to see if he could not secure some whiskey for his mother. On knocking at the door, he was asked what was wanted and told to go away that the occupants were busy. The witness testified that he recognized the voice as that of West, who, however, did not show himself.

Returning home young Whitmore said about an hour later, or about three o'clock, he heard two shots fired, but did not investigate. These were probably the shots that killed West.

When Hartness was called to the witness chair he stated that the game in which he and West were engaged did not last long, and he left the house about 7:30 or 8 o'clock. He went home to feed his horse, but as it had been fed by some other member of the family, he started for the dance, but for some reason changed his mind and returning home, went to bed. He had met no one since leaving West's house except the members of his family. On being examined, however, he made several contradictory statements, and while the jury failed to charge him with the crime, and the evidence was wholly circumstantial, it was deemed sufficient to warrant the arrest of the young man.

The examining trial of Hartness was held yesterday before Justice Ghormley.

When the body of West was discovered he had one dice in his hand and the other was found under it. It was also claimed that the day before he was killed he had quite a sum of money, but when found none of this money could be discovered. The revolver of the dead man was found in an adjoining room behind a trunk where it had fallen or been thrown. It was fully loaded and had not been fired. The tragedy is deplored and every effort will be made to bring the perpetrator to justice. A married daughter of

the dead man who lives at Eagle Lake, Texas, was telegraphed for and reached here Thursday. The funeral was held that afternoon and interment at Blue Springs cemetery, where the wife of the dead man is buried.

The entire community sympathizes with the family in their terrible loss. Crimes of this character are becoming too frequent. Human life is held too cheaply and the guilty party should be brought to swift and sure punishment.
