

Schedule of G. W. Deaton Co.

A schedule of liabilities and assets was filed in the United States court Wednesday morning in the bankrupt case of the G. W. Deaton Company, a corporation doing a general merchandise business at Eagle Lake. The total debts are stated by the president of the concern, Mr. B. Leysah, to be \$98,970.47 and the total assets \$126,150.13. The concern is now in the hands of a receiver, Mr. Chas. A. Warken, appointed since the filing of the petition by certain creditors.

The settlement is made in the schedule that the company is not indebted, but that it owes in preferred claims the sum of \$300 in wages to employees and \$50 to the president of the concern, as expenses incurred in connection with the effort to affect a settlement with its creditors.

Secured claims amount to \$65,373.67, divided as follows: To J. A. Robertson of Galveston one note for the sum of \$10,000, to Mrs. Anna Dittman of Alleton, Texas, notes for \$8,000, \$7,122.09 and \$36,251.58, respectively, and B. Leysah of Alleton one note for \$1000. The unsecured claims aggregate \$30,536.50, and among these are three notes held by Mr. Leysah for a total sum of \$15,445. The other amounts are much smaller and represent the claims of a score or more of persons.

The real estate held by the company is valued at \$13,000. Of this amount \$6000 is the estimated value of the property in Eagle Lake, where the store is located, and the remaining \$7000 is placed as the value of 751 acres of land in Matagorda county. The personal property is valued at \$52,155.12, and is divided as follows: Stock \$3,000, notes \$17,595.55, sundry items \$1589.57.

It is claimed that debts amounting to \$39,981.92 are due the firm, but it is stated that it is difficult to estimate the value of the open accounts. The company owns stock in the Eagle Lake Rice Mill to the value of \$1000, and holds 148 shares of stock in the Deaton Grocery Company of Wharton, of a par value of \$100 each, amounting in the aggregate to \$14,800. The money on deposit in the First National Bank of Eagle Lake is placed at \$1115.41, and in the Eagle Lake State Bank \$1067.18.
