

Proceedings of the Executive Committee of the White Man's Party.

On Feb. 10th, 1908, the executive committee of the white man's party met in Columbus in response to a call from the president of the party. Upon the roll call the following answered: S. L. Green, J. H. Vogelsang, J. G. Reita, George Hoy, H. A. Boesch, William Struss, Anton Kallos, Joe Buxkaup, H. Braden and M. E. Guyon.

It was moved and seconded that the following be adopted:

That each of them holding legal proxies. Motion carried and proxies seated.

It was moved and seconded that Julius Kutzbe, Senior, be appointed precinct chairman for Bernardo precinct, to take the place of Jacob Brode, deceased. Motion carried and Mr. Kutzbe seated.

It was moved and seconded that the white man's primary election be held on the first Saturday in May, 1908, same being May 2nd. Motion carried and May 2nd, 1908, fixed as the day for holding the white man's primary election.

It was moved and seconded that each candidate for county office shall pay to the secretary of the white man's party, as candidate's fee, to defray the expenses of the election, the sum of five dollars; and that all candidates for precinct offices shall pay the sum of \$2.50, as candidate's fee. Motion duly carried.

It was moved and seconded that each candidate for election at the white man's primary, shall be required to appear before Hugh R. Brown, secretary of the white man's party, in Columbus, Texas, pay the fee above stipulated, and subscribe the oath required by the laws of the white man's party, not later than 6 o'clock p. m. on April 20th, 1908; that any candidate who neglects to appear on or before said April 20th, 1908, and qualify before 6 p. m. on said day, shall forfeit his right to have his name placed upon the white man's primary ticket. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that a blank be left upon each ticket, upon which the voters of each voting precinct shall vote for a precinct chairman for the succeeding two years, for their respective precincts, and that the one receiving the highest number of votes for precinct chairman shall be declared elected. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that the question be submitted to the people at the said white man's primary election, as to whether or not candidates for office who have held the same county or precinct office for two successive terms shall be barred from re-election to such office. Motion lost.

No further business coming before the said committee, committee adjourned subject to the call of the president of the white man's party.
