Reasons for Christians Attending Religious Services.

Much has been written on the subject of this article. Many have sought a solution of the problem of getting the world to attend religious services. It is evident that if the unsaved are ever reached with the gospel, Christians must carry it to them or the unsaved must be induced to attend our services where the gospel is preached. As but few can be, or at least have been induced to engage in personal work in soul winning, the unsaved must be induced to attend religious services, where they may be brought under the power of the gospel. It is with the view of accomplishing the latter that the writer offers the following reasons for Christians attending religious services:

First. We are commanded: "Not forsaking the assembling of yourselves together, as the manner of some is," is the language of scripture. (Heb. 10:25.) It is not optional with a child of God whether or not he shall obey the plain commands of his Heavenly Father. That God has commanded, is reason sufficient for us to obey. To refuse to do what he has commanded is to question his authority. This is a great sin. If God's children do not respect and obey his will, how can we expect the world to respect and obey it? Christians are largely responsible not only for the indifference of the world to religion, but for their opposition to it.

Second. We cannot interest people in what we are not interested in. If we are not interested in the services of the church, it will be difficult to interest the world in them. If God's house has no attractions for Christians, how can we expect the world to be attracted to it? We love the association and companionship of our best friends. Jesus says: "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." (Matt. 18:20.) Our continued absence from the services of the church is proof that we do not love Christ; that we care nothing for his presence, his fellowship or his blessing. If our conduct shows that we do not love Christ, we can never induce the world to love Him. One indifference leads to the world to conclude that salvation is not important, and that

there is no sweetness nor preciousness in the gospel message.

Third. A good draws people. The earth has a greater attraction for bodies on its surface than have two small bodies for each other. A house filled with earnest worshippers has a greater attraction for the world than a handful of cold formalists. If we wish to see our pews filled with the unsaved, let God's people joyfully attend, and let there be real enthusiasm in the services.

Fourth. Whenever we absent ourselves from the services, except when providentially hindered, we manifest a dislike for the workman opposition to it. We are not to be understood as saying that help by attending, we hinder by staying away. We "gather with" Christ or we "scatter abroad." It is a sad sight to see a church a small part of which, with the pastor, are struggling to build up the cause of Christ while a large part are tearing down.

Fifth. A disposition to stay away from the services tends to destroy public worship, and hence to destroy the church. If one has the right to consult his own case, his own comfort and his interest in the matter of attending public worship, and concludes not to attend, then every member has that right, and if every member exercises this right there will cease to be public worship. A church that does not maintain public worship is doomed to die. Then, voluntary absence from church services tends to bring a pastor into disfavor and to cripple his influence. A stroke at a pastor is a stroke at the church and at her work. I would not be a member of an organization if I could not help it by giving my support with my presence at its meetings. I would not lend my influence to destroy it.

Sixth. It will do your pastor untold good if you attend. He can preach a better sermon when he faces a congregation of worshippers. He feels whenever you are present that he has your cooperation and your prayers. If you persistently remain away he feels that in order to the success of his work he must overcome your opposition.

Seventh. It will help your fellow worker in the kingdom if you attend. It is very encouraging to the regulars, the old guard, whenever you are present. They are more in the spirit and their worship is real and not formal.

Eighth. It will do you good to attend. God withholds his blessing from the disobedient. "He has a rod for the delinquent, and stripes for the fool's back." There is nothing more conducive to happiness and spiritual health than living in duty. Whenever God's people are united in one

great work—when they are "steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord," their "labor of love is not in vain in the Lord." You have no right to spend the Lord's day in your own work, to the neglect of the Lord's work, nor indulge yourself in your laziness and idleness while His cause suffers from neglect and the world perishes. Brother, sister, would you see the pews filled at every service with the unsaved? Fill your place with yourself. The world will have more respect for your God and your religion, and more confidence in you. Before God, have you ever neglected your duty?

Do you think that looking after your legal business, looking over your accounts of sales, cooking for boarders, or staying at home with wife and babies, a valid reason? It may be an excuse, but not a good reason. If you have no valid reason, you have missed much, lost much and hindered much. Will you not ever after this be present to "redeem the time?" Your pastor needs your help; your fellow-worker needs your cooperation, and the world needs your benediction.
