A Proclamation for the Election of City Officers.

The R. E. Walker dwelling house in this city, formerly occupied by R. S. Simmons, has been sold to Mr. J. P. Anderson by the trustees of the Vineyard, Walker & Co. bank for \$1,000. Mr. and Mrs. Anderson, after considerable improvements, are made on the place, expect to move into same. The people of Eagle Lake will be glad indeed to have these most excellent people move to town.

The farmers are complaining of the jack daws or large black birds pulling up the young corn. These birds are entering the fields in large droves and are doing great damage. Many of the farmers have begun poisoning against this pest.

We are informed that Mr. Wm. C. Zelle, manager of the large Bonus plantation, and Mr. Wm. K. Epp, bookkeeper and private secretary to Mr. Zelle, have both resigned their positions, to take effect immediately. We did not learn the future plans of Mr. Zelle or Mr. Epp, but it is our sincere wish that both may locate in Eagle Lake. It is understood that Mr. H. W. Rayner, manager of the Lakeside Sugar Refining Company, will have management of the Bonus plantation. The Bonus place is now under control of the same company as the Lakeside Sugar Refinery.

The leading Republicans of Colorado county held a conference at Columbus Wednesday. It was agreed to send a strong Lyon delegation to the state convention and to work for the selection of J. G. Schermack of Fayette and N. Q. Henderson of this county as delegates to the National Republican convention from this congressional district. Taft was the unanimous choice for the presidency.

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Columbus a Pretty Town.

Lieutenant Chamberlain, recruiting officer for the army, returned yesterday morning from an inspection trip to the temporary station now maintained for two weeks at Columbus, Texas, and after answering the mail at the recruiting station on Congress street, left for a ride on the Orile for the Beaumont station.

He examined four colored applicants at Columbus, but was forced to reject them all, as they came below the army's standard physical requirements.

Through the kindness of County Judge Mansfield of Colorado county, the supplies of the recruiting party stationed at Columbus will have the use of one of the vacant rooms to the army and the offer was accepted by the recruiting officer.

Columbus is the prettiest town I have visited in Texas, said Lieutenant Chamberlain yesterday. "The court house is an excellent building, the grounds are carefully laid out and cared for and with the wide, clean streets, regularly laid out and bordered by old live oaks, covered with Spanish moss, the scene of the public square and its surrounding streets with old fashioned houses and stores gave me the impression of what I have heard, and seen pictured, of an old time Southern city before the war. Everyone was mighty pleasant to me and the soldiers stationed there, and I look forward to my next visit with great pleasure."—Houston Post.
