A Proclamation for the Election of City Officers.

In obedience to an order of the City Council, made and entered on the minutes of said Council, and by virtue of the authority vested in me, as Mayor of the City of Eagle Lake, Texas, I hereby order and proclaim that a municipal election will be held within the corporate limits of said City, on the 15th day of April, 1908, same being the second Tuesday in said month, in the square in said City, weather permitting; if not, then in the City Council hall of said City, for the purpose of electing a Mayor for the ensuing term of two years, to succeed W. S. Strickland, now filling the unexpired term of J. C. Reister, whose term of office will have expired by said time.

A City Marshal for the ensuing term of two years, to succeed Abe Beakes, now filling the unexpired term of R. T. Westmorland, whose term will have expired by said date. And two Aldermen to succeed W. E. Welford and J. E. Roberts, whose terms of office will have expired by said date.

I hereby appoint T. J. Roberts, presiding judge of said election, with authority to select and appoint necessary associate judges and clerks.

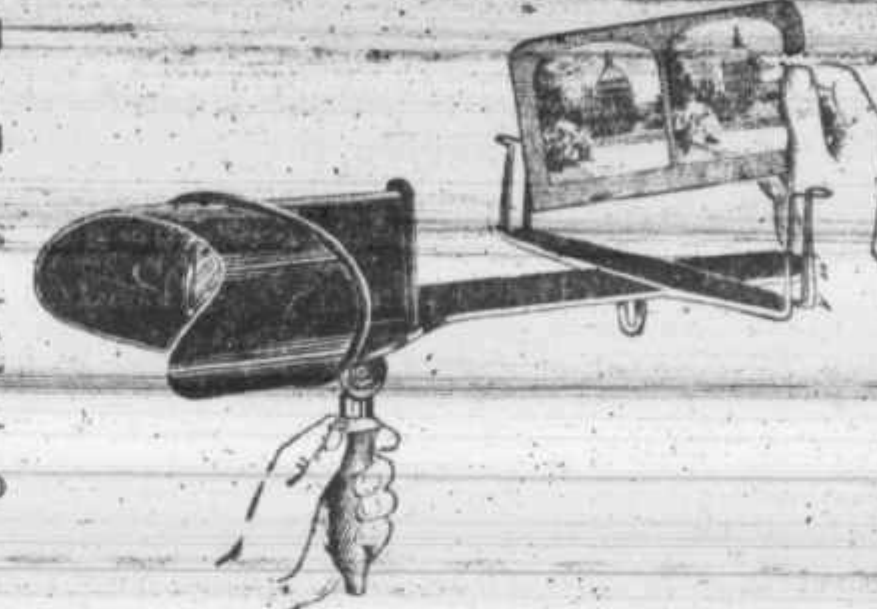
