Salt For Chickens.

Quite a number of years ago, I found one very reliable poultry book, that if you could put a small handful of common salt to each gallon of drinking water, you would never have cholera.

This I have practiced for years and I have never had a case of cholera on my place. I do not do this every day but two, three and four times a week. This salt method, however, some and they at once will begin to argue that salt kills chickens. So it will if a lot is thrown out among chickens that are not used to it.

Before they find out what it is, they will eat enough to kill them, but in our pasture I often see my turkeys stop and take two or three bites of salt. I sometimes lose a chicken, but not from any certain disease. Correspondence Exchange.
