The Democratic Primary. Columbus, May 5.—The Democratic Convention of Colorado County was called to order by Hon. W. L. Adkins, county chair man, who stated the object to be to select delegates to the Fort Worth state convention, which latter convention is to send delegates to the National Convention at Denver. Hon. Geo. Best was elected temporary and permanent chairman; J. O. Boettcher, secretary; J. J. Mansfield, assistant secretary; and E. B. Mayes, sergeant at arms. The following resolution was adopted: BE IT RESOLVED: That the Democratic Party of Colorado County in convention assembled, hereby indorses those fearless leaders of Democracy, Hon. William Jennings Bryan of Nebraska, and the Hon. Joseph Weldon Bailey of Texas. That the action of our congressman, Hon. Geo. F. Burgess be approved, and that we recommend him as a delegate to the national convention from the 9th congressional district, with the Hon. S. L. Green of Colorado county.

The following delegates to the state convention at Fort Worth were selected: Hon. S. L. Green, Hon. J. J. Mansfield, and Dr. F. O. Norris. As alternates, Hon. Geo. Herder, O. F. Laas and M. E. Gwynn, after which convention adjourned.
