Speech at Robert F. Nixon.

At Ottine Tuesday of last week there was a big barbecue and public speaking. Robert F. Nixon, candidate for district attorney of this district, was one of the speakers. We take the following report of his speech from the Gonzales Inquirer:

Ladies and gentlemen—I am glad of the opportunity of being with you today; I have always felt at home with the Ottine people. I was born and raised in a radius of ten miles of this place, and in this audience I have schoolmates; there are men present who soldiered in the Confederate army with my father; there are men present who have known me from my cradle up, and why should I not feel that I am among my friends?

I am a candidate for district attorney for this district, composed of Guadalupe, Colorado, Bexar and Gonzales counties. I asked a voter about my race a short time ago, and his reply was in these words:

"You have been county attorney for about eight years and have given general satisfaction and could have held the office as long as you wanted it without opposition, and I do not think that you ought to try and take Mr. Atkinson's office away from him." My reply to him was that the office is a public trust and no one can get in any way a title or right to own any office, that the district attorney's office belonged to the people and that they had the right to say who should represent them, and if I had made this county a good county attorney, and by my official record I convince you that I am better qualified and can give the people of this district better service than my opponent has done, I ought to have the office.

I think this one of the most important local offices you have and more depends upon this office in the protection of your home, your property and your person than any other office; there is more money spent, raised by taxation, in the enforcement of the criminal laws of this state than any other department of the state, therefore it is very important that you elect a qualified man for this position. He should be fearless in his prosecution; he should be honest and sincere in his official acts; sober while in the discharge of his official duties; and above all, he should be a competent lawyer. Elect a man with these qualifications and you will have no cause to complain about the criminal laws not being enforced and everyone who is prosecuted alike.

Our county depends upon the young men of today, you are bound to admit this is a progressive age, what was considered a good lawyer twenty years ago, today would be considered a very poor lawyer. I say to you fathers, likely you have boys who are trying to rise and make a mark in this world. If I am better qualified than my opponent to fill the district attorney's office, should I not have your vote? I say to the young men, we should offer a helping hand to each other where our qualifications deserve it. There is more in an office for a young man than what money he makes out of it.

You hear the old confederate veterans mentioned in this race. There is no one who has more respect and love for them than I have, because I am a son of a confederate soldier; I had four brothers and sisters, the war and one sleeps today in an un-

known and unmarked grave, and my father died after he returned home from the wounds he received in the war. The difference between my opponent and me, is that I was not old enough to go to the war and he was, and if I had been old enough I would have been in the front ranks, as I am in this race, and not with the home guards as my opponent was. He admits that he never left Gonzales county nor was he ever in a battle.

Both of our records are before you. My opponent has been your district attorney for six years and I your county attorney for eight years. Our official records are public property, as we are both democrats, the only difference between us is our qualifications. I discuss the official records so that you may see intelligently, and at the same time remembering that we are both good friends and this discussion is made with the best of feeling. I ask you to investigate our records, if you are not satisfied, and vote for the man who will give you the best work, "remembering that success is the standard of merit." During the last six years has the present district attorney ever convicted a single white man, that is put a single white man in the penitentiary where the defendant had a lawyer to defend him and fought his case in Gonzales county, without the assistance of private prosecution or the assistance of the county attorney? The district court records show that he has never convicted a white man under these circumstances. Has the present district attorney ever been able to draw an indictment either for forgery or perjury that would stand in the courts where the defendant had a lawyer to defend him, without the assistance of private prosecution or the county attorney, in Gonzales county? The district court records show that he has never been able under these circumstances to draw a proper indictment. What do these conditions mean? That no white man will be convicted where he is able to fight his case and no man will be convicted for forgery or perjury where he is able to fight case, unless parties interested in seeing the law enforced, go down in their pockets and hire a lawyer to assist the district attorney; at the same time you will be paying taxes to furnish money to pay your district attorney \$200 a year. The last case that was before the district court where the defendant had money to employ a lawyer to defend him, charged with forgery, was a negro by the name of S. K. McKinney, who attempted to pass a forged check on Miller & Sayer's bank, about a year ago. The forgery was detected as soon as the check was presented for payment at the bank and the negro was immediately arrested and positive proof secured of his guilt, and the grand jury indicted him. When the case was called for trial the attorney for the defendant had the case dismissed on account of a defective indictment drawn by the district attorney. The negro was arrested again and six months later the next grand jury returned another indictment against said negro and as soon as the case was called for trial the attorney of the defense had the case dismissed on account of a defective indictment written by the present district attorney, and today the negro is a free man although with positive proof against him on account

of the present district attorney being unable to draw an indictment that would stand in the courts.

If you are not satisfied as to the facts, as I have detailed them I refer you to the cashier of Miller & Sayer's bank, also to the cashier of G. N. Dillworth's bank as he was present when the negro attempted to pass said check.
