Revival Meeting.
Evangelists E. V. Spicer of Paducah, and E. M. Douthit of Austin arrived in the city Wednesday and are conducting a revival meeting at the Christian church, holding services every night. Bro. Spicer who is doing the preaching is a fluent and forcible speaker. He is a native of Kentucky and a graduate of Kentucky University of Lexington, Ky., and also of Center College of Danville, Ky. He has



been in the ministry the past twenty years and hundreds of people have come into the church under his preaching. He came to Texas four years ago and has been actively engaged in pastoral and evangelistic work all the time. He calls Texas his adopted state, and will make it his home, for he says he believes there is a great future for the Church of Christ in the Lone Star State.

Prof. Douthit, who is leading the singing, is not only a singer of national reputation, but he is one of the seven most popular music writers in the United States. He received a thorough musical education under the English and German masters. He was a boxwood chum of James Whitcomb Riley, and each of them began his "public life" the same year.

Prof. Douthit is giving his life to evangelistic work. He was called to Texas sixteen years ago and has been actively engaged in protracted meeting work since.

The following article concerning Evangelists Spicer and Douthit who are now in our city holding a protracted meeting at the Christian church appeared in last issue of the Granger News.

The evangelistic meeting conducted by Messrs Spicer and Douthit in the opera house for the past few weeks came to a most successful close on Wednesday evening. It had been in

tended to close Tuesday evening but the evangelists were requested to remain over one more night, which they consented to do.

This is considered one of Granger's greatest meetings and some think the greatest. It has certainly done more for the Central Christian church than has anything yet done for the upbuilding of this congregation. The gospel has been earnestly preached and the seed thoroughly implanted in the hearts of men, women and children and an abundant harvest will be reaped for years to come.

In all there were thirty-four accessions to the local church of congregation and the result of the meeting was the locating of a pastor, who with his family will move to Granger. Elder R.
