Great Crop at Sugarland.

N. V. Truly, auditor and general manager of the Sugarland railway, in being interviewed by a reporter of the Houston Post Tuesday, gave out the following news concerning the cane crop at Sugarland and the building of the Imperial Valley line:

"The cane crop at Sugarland is the best we have ever had," said Mr. Truly to a Post representative. "We are milling eighteen to twenty tons to the acre, and it is as fine a quality of cane as any one wants to see. We are all pleased with the 1908 crop, and if each crop in the future is as good we will have no cause for complaint."

The capacity of the Cunningham Sugar company's mill at Sugarland is seventy cars per day.

The Imperial Valley railroad is constructing a road from Sugarland to Hempstead. The workmen, Mr. Truly states, will be in to Harlem with the track this week and the balance of the track is to be pushed to completion as rapidly as possible.—Richmond Coaster.
