Weidemann's wild west show is advertised to give two performances here on December 26th, afternoon and night. The Danville & Kasper Carnival Company will be here on December 28th, for a week's engagement. This is the same carnival company that was here last season, though their representative informs the HEADLIGHT that the company has been considerably strengthened since it was here last year. He says the company now has twelve good shows. The carnival will be held at the same grounds as last year and will be under the auspices of the Eagle Lake Band.

A Retail Merchants' Protective association was organized here last week by Mr. Gaddy, who is traveling in the interest of the state organization. The association begins with a membership of eighteen. The association will be affiliated with the state organization. Its motive is to protect the members against people who do not pay their bills. After the association is thoroughly organized, it is going to be a hard matter for those in Eagle Lake known to be "hard pay" to get credit from any business house in town.

The Hardy Satsuma and Quamquat Oranges budded onto Citrus Trifoliata root, are receiving more serious consideration by a large number of people throughout the Coast Country than any other new industry that has come to this country.

Large groves are being planted in many localities by the old settlers. The Nurseryman and Horticulturist especially recommend our prairie soil with its rich, clay subsoil for this fruit. These trees are recommended to stand a freeze or temperature of 10 degrees above zero without receiving injury. The fruit is very choice. The trees are ornamental. Orange blossoms are nicer than roses. They add beauty, comforts and value to every city or farm house.
