An Election Proclamation.

In obedience to an order of the city council of the City of Eagle Lake, made and entered on the minutes on the 15th day of February, 1909, and by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Eagle Lake, Texas, I do hereby order and proclaim that a municipal election will be held within the corporate limits of said City on the first Tuesday in April, the same being the 6th day of said month, for the purpose of electing three aldermen, to succeed M. E. Gaynn, W. A. Dallas and G. W. Keith whose terms of office will have expired by said date; also to elect a city attorney to succeed P. P. Putney, whose term of office will have expired by said date. It is further ordered that the said election may be held in the City Hall and T. J. Roberts is hereby appointed presiding judge with authority to select and appoint such assistant judges and clerks as may be required by law, for the purpose of holding said election.

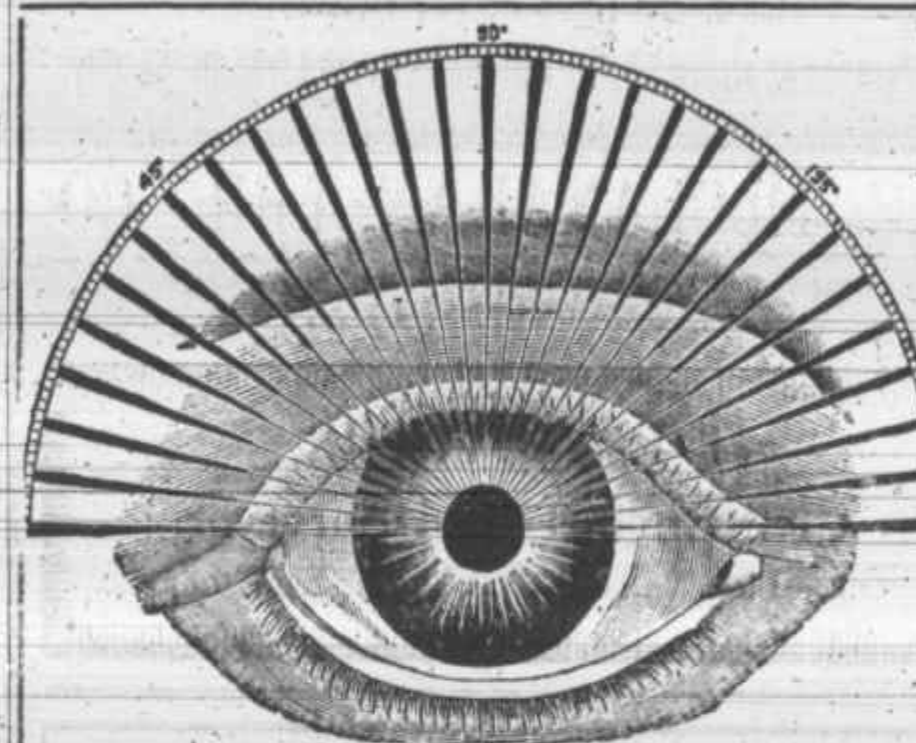
