Roberts is hereby appointed presiding judge with authority to select and appoint such assistant judges and clerks as may be required by law, for the purpose of holding said election.

ROZEOSKI SERIOUSLY CUT.

Received Deep Gash in Throat in Difficulty With a Negro.

In a difficulty in the rear of Mr. Brosig's saloon building at about 9 o'clock last Saturday night between Joe Rozeoski and Jack Skaggs, the former received a dangerous cut in the throat. The wound in Rozeoski's throat is about three inches deep and about four inches long, though there are several minor cuts and scratches on his face and neck. Rozeoski is a Bohemian farmer and lives on the Kirby land, about five miles from town, and is well known in Eagle Lake. Jack Skaggs is a negro farmer and is also well known here. He was arrested by City Marshal Vineyard and released under a \$500 bond.

Rozeoski is under indictment for the killing of a negro and his case was set for trial in the district court at Columbus last Monday but on account of his condition, the case had to be continued. Rozeoski when he was last heard from, was in a very serious condition.

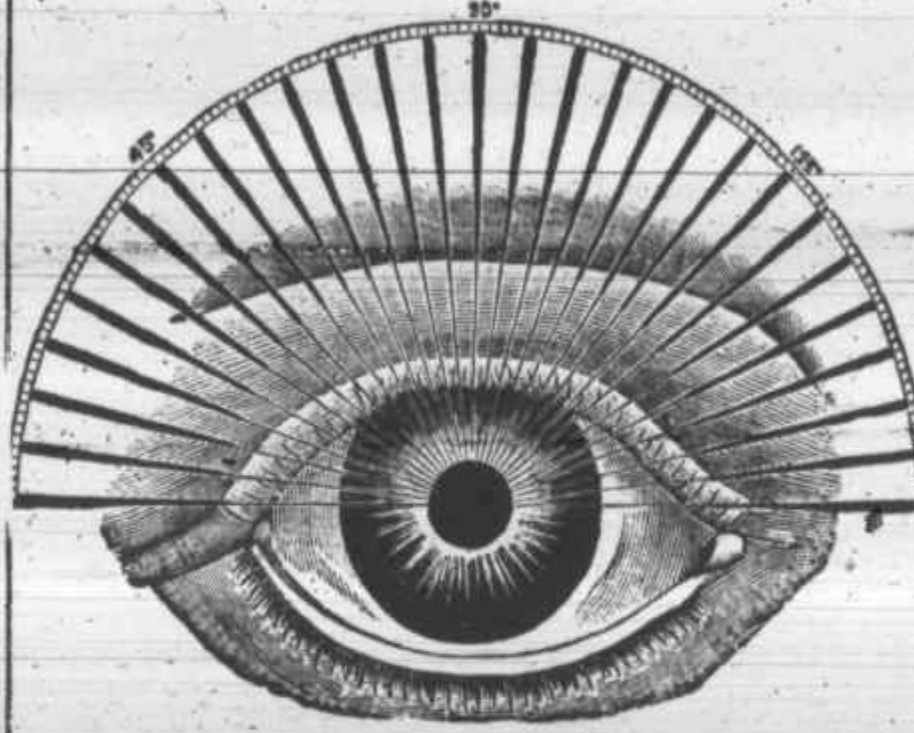
