How to Kill Johnson-Grass.

T. H. Ferguson, one of Hays
county's most successful farm-
ers, has for many years planted
land to Johnson grass and the
year following entirely reclaimed
the land for other crops. In a
letter to Commissioner Kone he
outlines his practice as follows:

"In the spring there is a mass
of roots in the ground. These
roots make the new grass. When
this grass is headed new roots
are put out in every direction.
Each of these new roots has a
bud that will make a new top no
matter how deep it may pene-
trate the ground; it will come to
the surface sooner or later. By
carefully keeping this new top
down continually for one year
can completely exterminate the
grass. My plan is to sow the
grass in the spring. Make two
cuttings of hay. Then at once
plant the land to fall oats. Cut
the oats the following spring; re-
move them promptly and at once
plant the land in cotton and cul-
tivate well. By this method one
can thoroughly eradicate Johnson
grass. I have killed lots of it."

"Another way of killing John-
son grass is to pasture the grass
during the spring. Plow it up in
August. Let the stock run on
the plowed land; they will pick
and eat up the roots. Later on
give the land a second plowing,
keep the stock on the land. Dur-
ing the winter bed up the land
and take the cattle off. Cultivate
well during the following year.
By this method much work can
be saved."

It should be clearly understood
that Mr. Ferguson cuts his grass
while in bloom and never lets it
go to seed. There is no use try-
ing to eradicate Johnson grass

that is allowed to mature seed.
Aside from being a valuable
hay crop Johnson grass is a most
excellent plant to use in rotation
with other crops, especially cot-
ton. Johnson grass roots adds
humus to the soil and puts the
soil in better condition for the
crops that follow.—Dallas Semi-
Weekly News.
