ROAD BOND ELECTION POSTPONED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT.

The proposed election to determine whether or not the county should issue bonds in the sum of \$250,000 for the purpose of building roads, which was set for March 7th, has been cancelled and postponed by the Commissioners' Court for such action as may later be developed. It is generally believed that the court will put the election to the proposed election at the March meeting of the court. The court's order setting aside the election is as follows:

"Whereas, on the 3rd day of January A. D. 1911, this court in acting upon the petition of more than the number of petitioners required by law, ordered that an election be held in all the voting precincts of Colorado County on Tuesday, the 7th day of March A. D. 1911, for the purpose of determining whether or not five per cent bonds of the county shall be issued to the amount of \$250,000 for the purpose of constructing gravel and turn-pike public roads, and for the further purpose of determining whether or not an additional tax of 15

cents on \$100 valuation of taxable property shall be levied for the purpose of creating a sinking fund for the redemption of said bonds at maturity, and, Whereas, it is estimated that said election will cost the county something more than \$400, to be paid out of the general fund, in which fund there is now a deficit at the beginning of the year, on account of the proposed levy of it for the repairs of the court house, and, Whereas, it is reasonably certain to the members of this court that said proposition will be defeated, but if not defeated, then that it is very improbable that said bonds can be sold.

Therefore, with a view of arranging an agreement with the petitioners in order to save the unnecessary expense to the county of said election: It is hereby ordered that the date fixed for the holding of said election, to-wit, March 7th, 1911, be and it is hereby cancelled and set at naught and this matter is hereby postponed for such action as may hereafter be determined, and the clerk is requested to give notice to this effect.

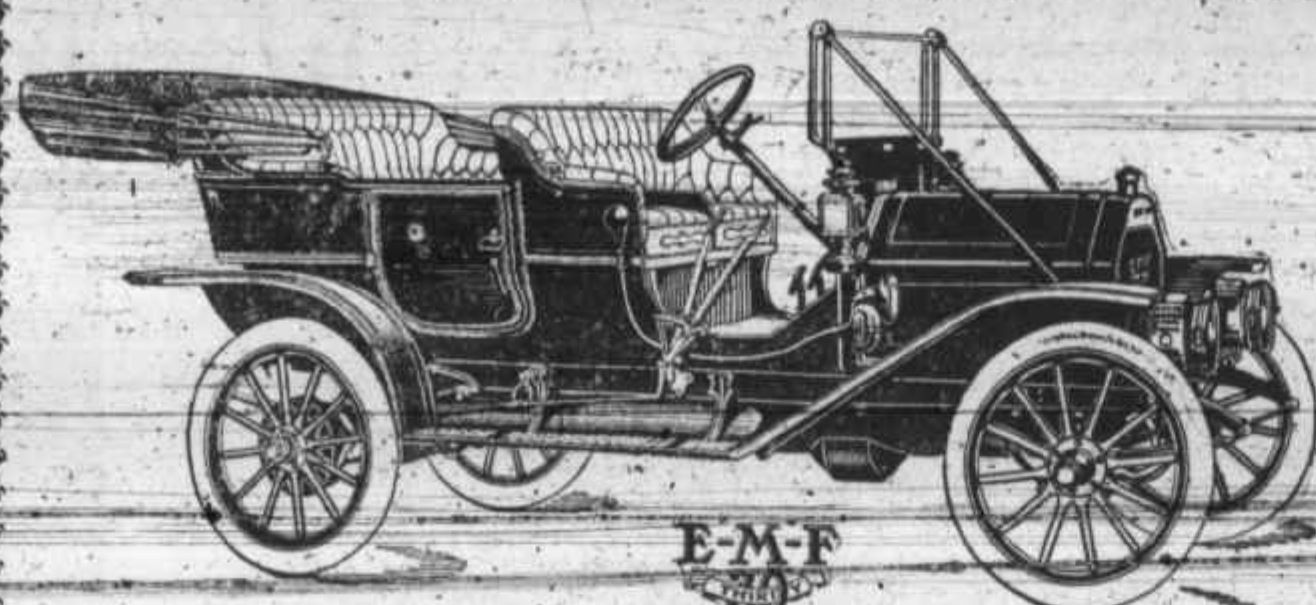
