come a great strawberry ship-
ping center.

sales manager of the Southern
Rice Growers' Association, was
in Eagle Lake Monday afternoon
in conference with the local man-
ager, Mr. E. A. Higgins, and the
local millers. Mr. Higgins de-
clines at this time to give any
information relative to the partic-
ulars of the big export deal
that the association has just
made. We have learned from re-
liable sources however, that the
association has sold over 300,000
bags of Honduras rice to be ex-
ported to Germany and Holland.
All of the rice is still in the hands
of the millers.

is included in this sale. These
rices will be milled by local mil-
lars, and will be exported from
Galveston. The planters will re-
ceive association prices for this
rice. It is the purpose of the
association to export this big lot
of rice to cut down the carry-
over and make it possible to
maintain a higher scale of prices
for the crop of 1911. Manifestly
it would be impossible to handle
a deal of this magnitude ex-
cept by organized effort, and it is
an evident fact that the exporta-
tion of this large quantity of
rice is sure to mean higher prices
this fall. The association is
doing splendid work for the bet-
terment of conditions in the rice
belt and should receive the hearty
support and encouragement of
every rice grower.

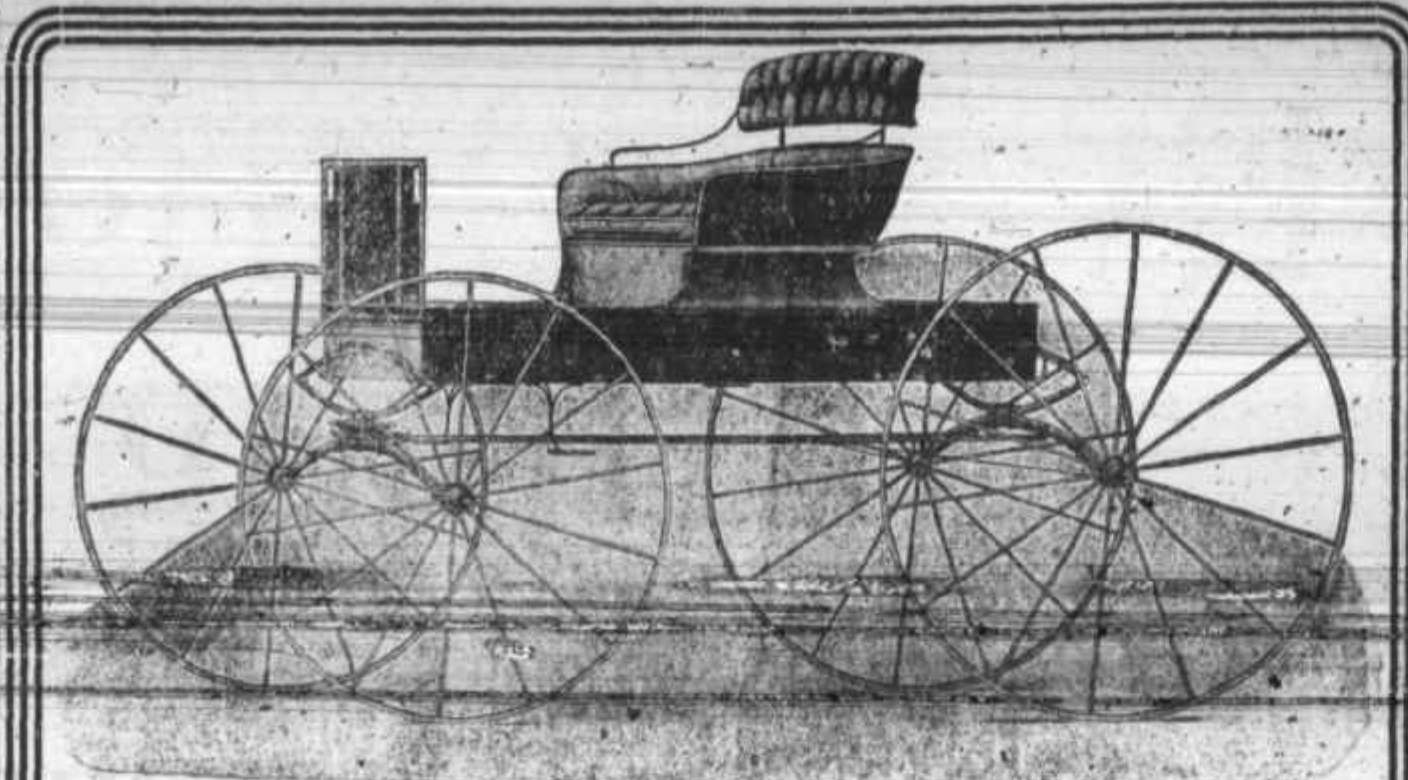
The Mission Helper, published
