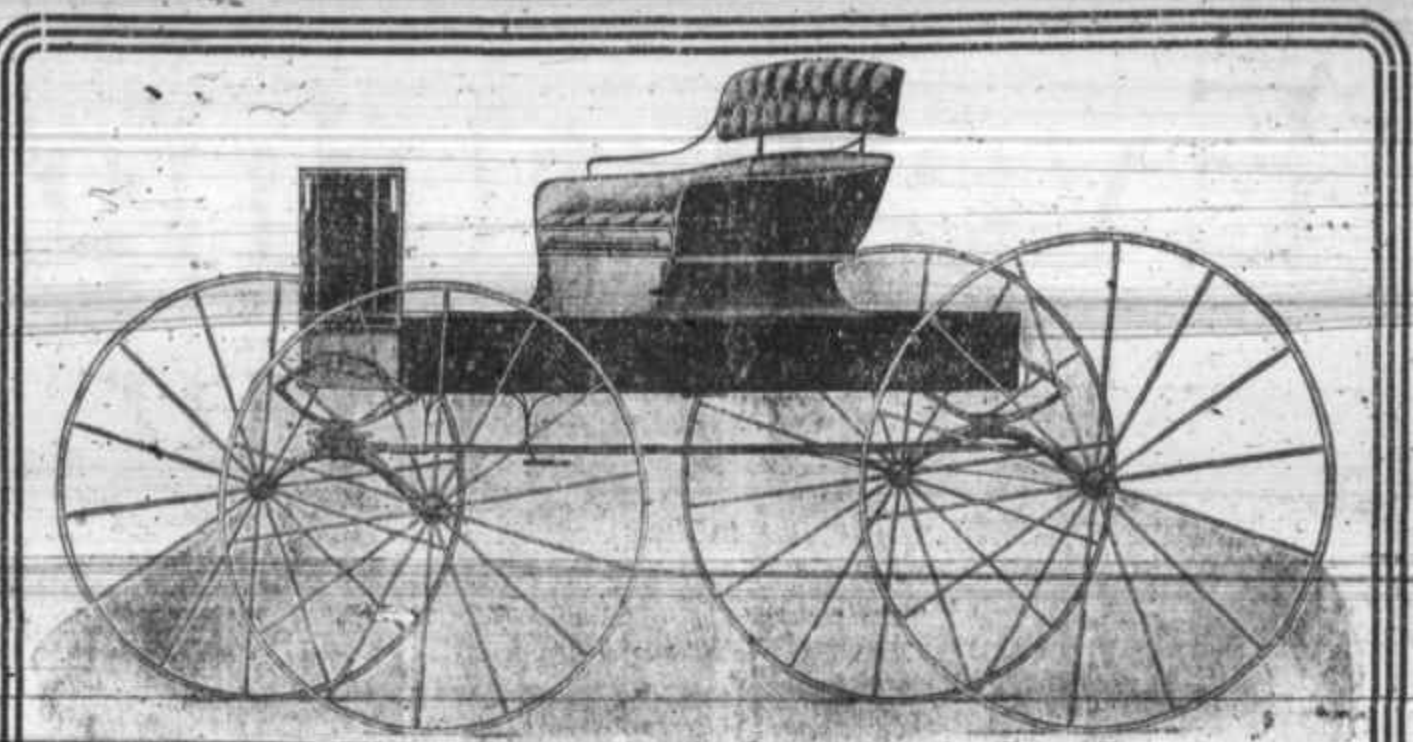

But this is only half of it—for there are two crops of potatoes grown each year on the same land. The small town two paper proposition is rapidly passing, for in this day of hustle and progress the business men and public spirited citizens no longer want two papers going out from their town looking like objects of charity, but they want a good, live, well patronized paper issued from their town, one in which the enterprise and progress of the town will be reflected—one that will be an advertisement for the town in which it is printed.

**An Ordinance.**  
An ordinance prohibiting the placing or building, or causing to be built or placed any privy or hog pen nearer than thirty feet to any public street or causing the same to remain nearer than thirty feet and providing a penalty.  
Be it ordained by the city council of the city of Eagle Lake—That if any person, the owner or lessee or renter of any lot or lots, or building in this city, shall build or place, or put or cause the same to be done, any privy or hog pen nearer than thirty feet upon or near any public street, or allow same to remain nearer than thirty feet upon or near said public street, shall be considered as maintaining a public nuisance and shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not less than five dollars, and not more than twenty dollars, provided after the owner or the party who has the premises in charge, receives notice from the city marshal to remove said privy or hog pen thirty feet from said street, that each ten days the said privy or hog pen remains nearer than thirty feet to said street shall be deemed a separate offense.  
All ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
