form the duties of those offices.

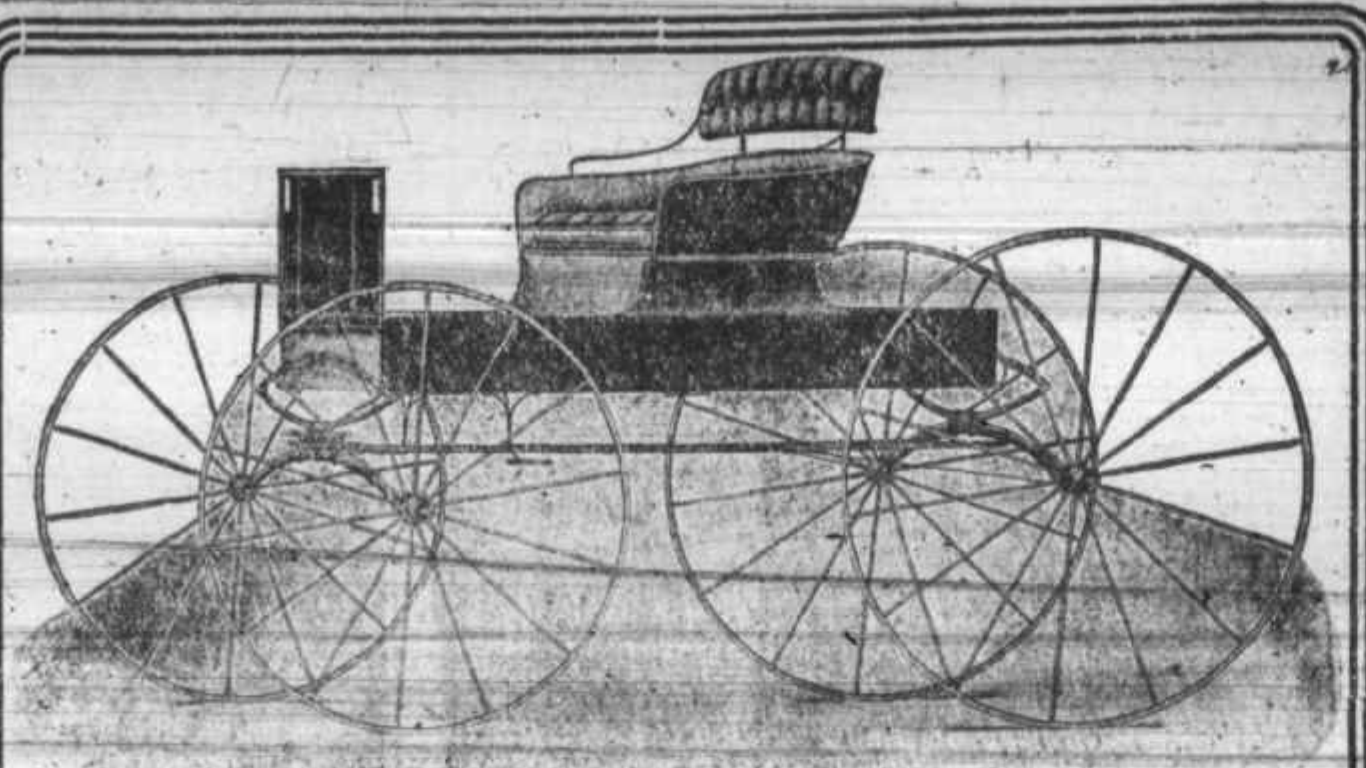

The Eagle Lake baseball team
went to Hallettsville last Sunday
and defeated the Hallettsville
team in a one-sided, uninterest-
ing, easy game by a score of 7 to
0. Englehard pitched the shut
out against Hallettsville.

On the following day the Cuero
team, composed of the best play-
ers of Cuero and Yoakum, came
to Hallettsville to show Eagle
Lake a thing or two in ball play-
ing. The game was played at
Hallettsville Monday afternoon.
The Cuero-Yoakum team was
noisy, full of hot air and put up
a fine practice game, but when it
came down to playing baseball
they can't play marbles. They
were long on squabbling and
short on hitting. The cause of
Cuero-Yoakum's crushing defeat

Much Vann." Eagle Lake's
