There is a considerable agitation for
the county for a "two term"
clause into the White Man's Party,
and we are told, this agitation is
being carried on with favorable comment every-
where. Some of the leading citizens of
the county are in favor of it. While the
Headlight is friendly toward every
officeholder serving in the county, it
believes a "two term" clause will be
the best possible plank that can
further the cause of the white man's
primary. This paper for one strong-
ly endorses the move. We are told
that several leading citizens of the
county have given intention of enter-
ing the race at the next election sub-
ject to the white man's primary on the
"two term" ticket. One an Eagle Lake
citizen. It is quite probable that there
will be a full "two term" ticket in the
field, from county judge to surveyor.

It is significant that the HEAD-
LIGHT observed a strict neutral-
ity as to precinct officers. The
county-commissioner, justice of
the peace and constable of the
Eagle Lake precinct have all held
office for more than two terms,
and for a much longer period of
time than have a large majority
of the county officers. If the
HEADLIGHT editor is a "two
termer" from principle, he is
against them all. If he is not a
"two termer" from principle, but
only has an ax to grind, and is
willing to exempt from the term
propaganda the offices
which are already filled by men
of his own town, then his logic
loses much of its force. —Colo-
rado Citizen.

We did not expect this move
to sit well with the Colorado Cit-
izen, which is edited and manag-
ed by County Judge J. J. Mans-
field and in which six or seven of
the county officers are stock-
holders, and for these reasons
the Citizen's article needs no
comment from us. However, we
state for the judge's special ben-
efit, that, using the words "county
officers" in a broad sense, we
were under the impression that
"county officers" included pre-
cinct officers, for the precinct is
certainly in the county. As this
is the only defense Judge Mans-
field offers for his stand against
the two term move, we will go
even further and say that we are
in favor of the two term move in
city offices. It is a principle of
democracy. We do not think it
fair and just in Judge Mansfield
insinuating, or rather saying
that the HEADLIGHT editor has

an ax to grind in advocating the
two term move. We have no ax
to grind, and we will ask the
Judge to explain to his readers
how the editor of this paper can
have any ax to grind.

"Old Brindle" has had her day
in Eagle Lake. Our citizens see
the need of a stock law. They
see where a stock law will help
Eagle Lake grow and prosper
and they are going to vote for a
stock law. When the stock law
is put to a vote it is going to car-
ry with an overwhelming major-
ity—Eagle Lake Headlight.

We have been blessed with a
stock law about two years ago
and with a city marshal who never
suffers from fatigue in chasing
down and impounding the wan-
dering bovine. The result is that
fences have been taken down
and terraces are beginning to
put in their appearance. The
farmer can put his sack of flour
in his wagon, go off and leave it
and not have the town cow to
tear the sack to pieces while he
is not watching. We do not have
to kick "Old Brindle" out of the
road as we walk down the street
and have to see and hear about
him. We are now at peace with
them. We sleep in peace, knowing
that the town cow is relegated to
the closed pen and that we will
not find her in our flower bed
the next morning. Every town
of a size in Texas should have a
stock law. —Richmond Hornet.

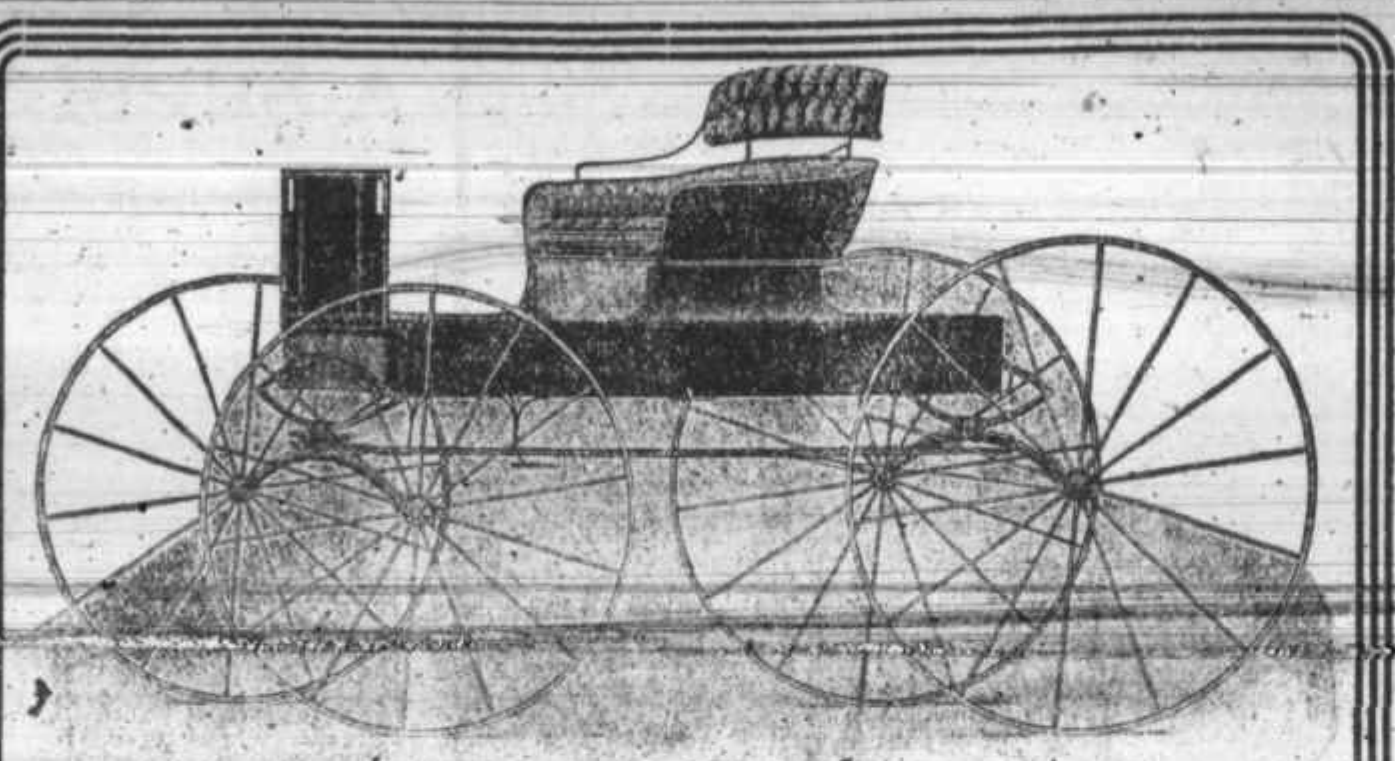
