make the surrounding grounds

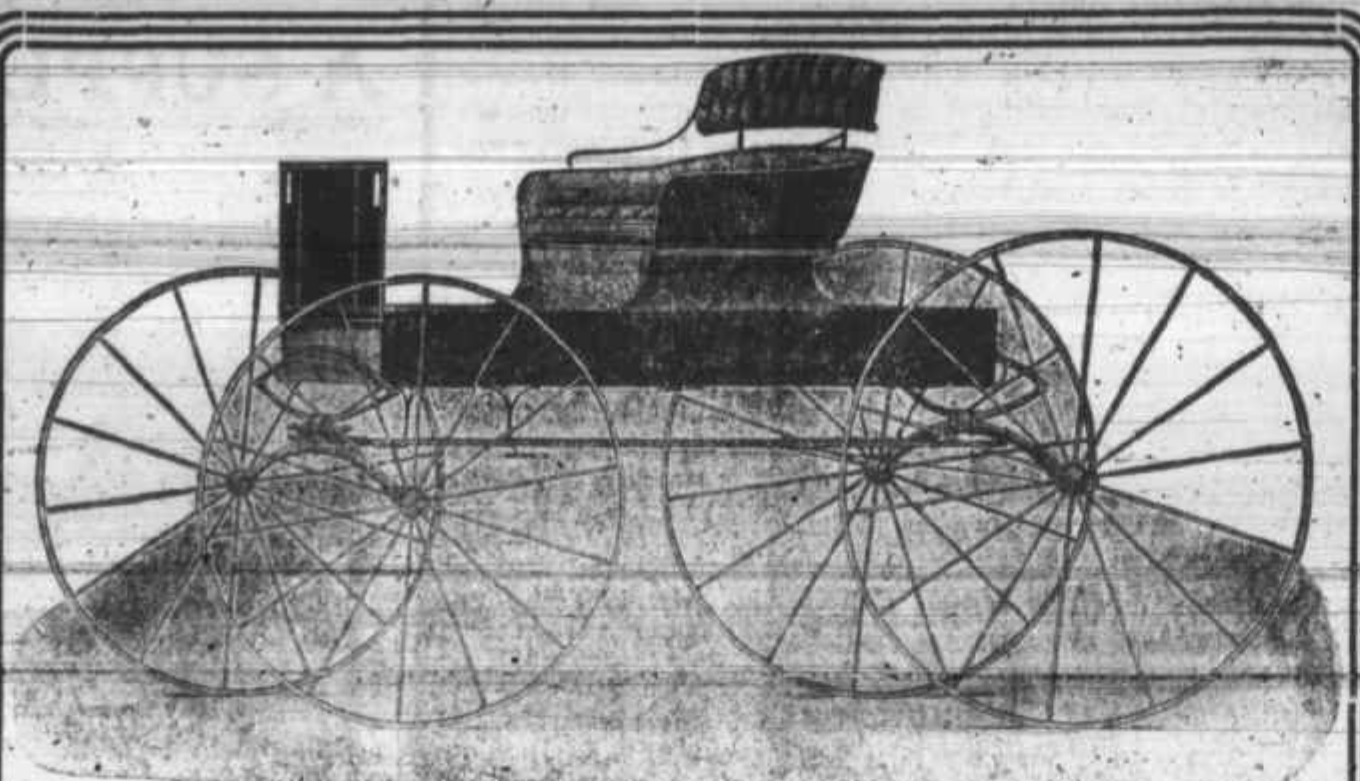
Notice!

examining trial of Frank Stelzig,
charged with killing Will Clemen-
ts at Pledger, both sides rest-
ed after examining one witness,
