At a meeting of the school
board Monday night Prof. Cruse
of the State Experimental Sta-
tion at Fort Worth, was elected
to take charge of the agricultural
and manual training department
of the Eagle Lake high school.
He will begin work here as soon
as the equipment arrives. Prof.
J. H. Morgan made a trip to Aus-
tin Saturday and secured an ap-
propriation of \$2,000 from the
State Department of Education
to install this department of ag-
ricultural and manual training
in the Eagle Lake school. Prof.
Cruse will co-operate with any
of the farmers of this district,
analyze soils and advise with
them as to the best fertilizers to
be used, and he will render them
any assistance in his power. He
has had experience with the State
experimental stations and also
with the United States stations.
The board intends to build up
one of the best schools in the
State. The patrons of the school
should lend the members of the
school board every aid and en-
couragement.
