Texas Game Laws.

Austin, Tex., Sept. 25.—Chief
Game Warden Cox, in answer to
numerous inquiries concerning
the game laws and how to obtain
hunting licenses for the coming
season, has prepared a statement
giving the points of the law and
other rules to be observed by
hunters during the open season.
The statement is as follows:

"To hunt in any county in this
state, other than the county of
one's residence, it is necessary
to procure a nonresident county
hunting license. This license
costs \$1.75 and can be procured
from the county clerk of the
county in which the person re-
sides.

"A nonresident of the state
must procure a nonresident state
hunting license. This costs, \$15,
and can be procured from the
state game, fish and oyster com-
missioner at Austin, or from any
deputy game warden in the state.

"The open season for hunting
deer begins November 1 and ends
December 31. Only buck deer,
or deer with horns, may be tak-
en; provided that any one person
shall not kill more than three
buck deer during the open sea-
son. It is unlawful to kill a doe
or spotted fawn. Hunting with
lamp or lantern is prohibited.

"The open season for wild tur-
keys December 1 and ends
March 31. The limit is three
turkeys during the open season
for any one person.

"The opening season for shoot-
ing quail and doves begins No-
vember 1 and ends January 21.
It is lawful for any one person to
kill as many as twenty-five of
these birds in any one day dur-
ing the open season, but no
more.

"There is no closed season for
wild geese, ducks, plover, snipe,
jacksnipe, curlews, robins, or
chickadees; however, it is unlawful
for any person to kill more than
twenty-five of the above men-
tioned fowls or birds in any one
day of twenty-four hours.

"It is unlawful to kill any wild

Mongolian or English pheasant,
wild prairie chickens (pinnated
grouse), wild antelope or Rocky
Mountain sheep at any time for
five years (from June 11, 1911,
to June 11, 1916).

"It is unlawful to take any
wild bird or wild fowl by netting
or trapping.

"It is unlawful to kill any wild
geese or wild ducks by any
means other than by an ordi-
nary gun capable of being held
to or shot from the shoulder.

"It is unlawful to sell or offer
for sale or have in possession for
sale, or have in possession after
purchase any game or game
birds mentioned in this article.
"It is unlawful to kill or in any
manner injure any mockingbird,
whippoorwill (Hull bat), night
hawk, redbird, finch, thrush,
linnet, wren, martin, swallow,
bobolink, catbird, nonpareil, sea-
gull, tern, shearwater, egret, he-
ron or peewee.

"A person may ship to his
home as many as one day's bag
limit of his game, except of wild
ducks, of which he may ship as
many as three days' bag limit, or
seventy-five ducks; provided, he
accompany the shipment on the
same train or common carrier.
To make such shipment, the
shipper shall make the prescribed
affidavit, setting out that he
killed the game within the law,
the place of his residence, etc.

"It is not unlawful to kill En-
glish or European house spar-
rows, crows, buzzards, hawks
(except night hawks), blackbirds,
ricebirds, and owls.

"It is unlawful for any one
person to kill more than ten
squirrels in any one day or sell
more than five squirrels in any
one week; this, however, does
not apply to any county situated
in the second, fifth, ninth, tenth,
twelfth, fourteenth, seventeenth,
eighteenth, twenty-first, twenty-
fourth and thirty-first senatorial
districts under the apportion-
ment 1901. It is unlawful to sell
or ship squirrels in Montgomery
county; and it is unlawful to ship
squirrels in Liberty county.

"There is a heavy penalty for
any one hunting without a license
as prescribed. A land owner,
peace officer or game warden
has the right to demand to be
shown one's license when found
hunting."

Grand Jury Report Not Explicit.

That part of the grand jury
report, published in this paper
last week, which reads:

"We have examined the re-
port of the finance committee
and find that it shows some of
the old officers, also some of
the present officers, to be be-
hind with their accounts. This
should be looked into care-
fully by the commissioners' court."

Is, in the opinion of this paper,
not as fully explained as it should
be. It does not state who these
particular officers are, and the
sentiment of the people of the
county might possibly be turned
against some county official or
officials through this part of the

of the jury report was not direct-
ed. Therefore, in justice to the
county officials who are not be-
hind with their accounts, and in
justice to the people of the coun-
ty, whose tax money pays their
salaries in office, this paper con-
tends that the names should be
made known. The grand jury
has asked that the commis-
sioners' court carefully look into the
matter, and it is now up to the
commissioners' court to print
the findings of its investigation
in the regular proceedings of its
session.
