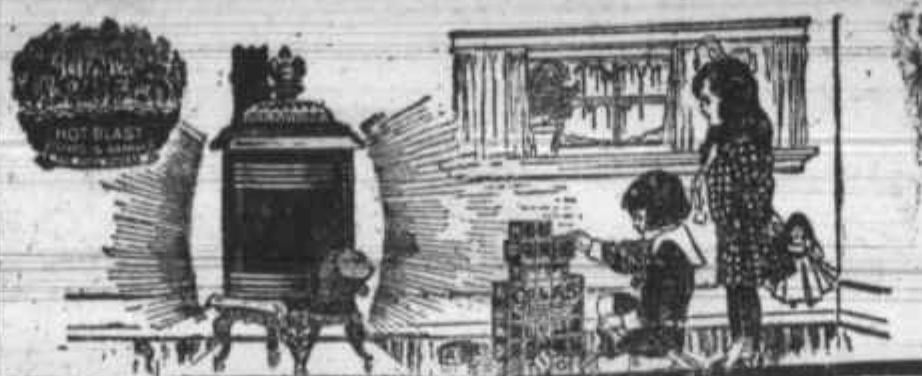

MUST ACCEPT SHIPMENT

Austin, Texas, Oct. 3.—Holding that the railroad between Anchor and the Ramsey farm, in Brazoria county, that the State sold to W. T. Eldridge in 1909, is and has been a common carrier, Acting Attorney General (first assistant) James D. Walthall this afternoon returned to Railroad Commissioner John L. Wortham the complaint of the penitentiary commission that Eldridge had refused to transport cane on this road from the Ramsey farm to the Clement farm via Bra-zoria and the Sugarland road, thereby tying up the cane crop of the convict farm and the prison system. The penitentiary commission Saturday complained to Commissioner Wortham of this condition and he referred the matter to the attorney general.

Mr. Walthall declares that the short line railroad, by reason of the nature of the traffic, is not past, is a common carrier, and as such is obliged to accept shipments of cane from the convict farms. Mr. Eldridge for many years leased convict labor on his plantation, but the commission cancelled these contracts. It is understood, the controversy resulted from this situation.
