Since the season opened ap-
proximately twenty cars of pec-
ans have been shipped from this
station. The average weight per
car is 80,000 pounds and the nuts
have brought a fraction in excess
of 10 cents per pound on an av-
erage for the season. In other
words, the pecan has brought
into local circulation something
in the neighborhood of \$85,000 of
outside money. That's not so
bad for a crop which cost no
money for seed, cultivation or
care. Certainly where trees
grow in cultivated fields, they
have been a bit in the way of other
crops, but they have paid an
ample dividend on the land they
occupy. —Wharton Sceptator.
