SOLD A BIG LOT OF RICE WON HAT ON RICE WAGER

Southern Rice Growers' Ass'n. Sells Big Lot at \$3.50.

Mr. E. A. Egnus, the local manager of the Southern Rice Growers' Association has sold about ten thousand sacks of rice on a basis of \$3.50 per barrel within the last week. Messrs. O. E. Duddleson and B. B. Hayden topped the local market with the price of \$3.52 for their Honduras. Practically all of the rough rice in the entire Eagle Lake district has been sold. There never has been a year since rice was first grown in this section that the planters have been able to dispose of their entire crop on a rising market so soon after the threshing season closed.

Where the Holly Grows.

The old-fashioned Christmas greens were rosemary, ivy and bay, but now there is a touch greater variety. Best loved of all is the glossy, red berried holly. "Holly" was the old English name for it, and it is thought to be identical with the "greenwood tree" of British ballads and of Robin Hood fame. On our side of the Atlantic the American holly is found from Maine, where it grows as a shrub, to North and South Carolina, where it lifts a symmetrical cone of dark, shining leaves set with scarlet berry clusters along a beautiful trunk of gray and silver to the height of seventy or eighty feet.

Delaware and Maryland are usually credited with furnishing the best grades of holly to the Christmas markets.

MERCURY 15 THIS MORNING

Report Says Thermometer Will Drop 3 Degrees Tonight

This section is today in the grip of the most severe blizzard of the season. The thermometer registers 15 above, with the ground frozen and covered with sleet. The government weather report says the thermometer here will be 12 to 13 above tonight. The report received by wire this morning from New Orleans is as follows:

"Tonight fair, somewhat cold, temperature will be 12 to 13 in sugar and truck regions. Saturday fair and not so cold; brisk to high northerly winds, which will subside during Saturday."

The present blizzard struck suddenly. At dark yesterday evening the thermometer registered 48, and within two hours had fallen ten degrees. At noon yesterday people were going about in heavy coats and gloves. Today they are dressed as if ready for an expedition to the North Pole. Yes, we have a blizzard in Texas!

IMPROVEMENTS

Bath room and toilet in the house. There are 18 wells on the land that have been drilled for the purpose of irrigating said land, their depths ranging from 180 to 350 feet. From 1902 to 1906 the land has been put mostly in rice; from 1907 to 1909 the land has been cultivated in cotton, corn, Irish and sweet potatoes, etc.

The last three years the land has been put in rice, 750 to 800 acres in 1910 and 1911, 300 acres this year. The land formerly rented for \$5 an acre, will give bargain for 1912. Since 1910 the land is irrigated by the Rice & Cane Irrigation Canal, which takes its water from the Brazos River.

This land is located in Meadowbrook Farms, part in the Blas Herrera and the Middleton surveys.

The N. E. corner is 1 1/2 miles from Addicks, on the M., K. & T. R. R.; and the S. W. corner is 2 miles from Clodine, on the S. A. & A. P. The distance is about 18 miles to Houston. There is a good shell road from Houston to Addicks, following the M., K. & T. from Addicks to the land there is a good graded road (county road.)

The Buffalo Bayou runs about 3 1/4 mile north of the land; two good ditches 3/8 drain the land to the Bayou. One of the ditches is along the county road, running on the east line; the place is entirely fenced, and roads run all around it. The county has built a drainage ditch that runs about 3 1/4 of a mile south of the south line and can drain from 200 to 250 acres in the S. E. corner. This land is in Harris county, 1 1/2 miles from Fort Bend.
