John J. Raezer of Las Palmas,
Mexico, formerly engaged in the
rice growing and milling indus-
try at Eagle Lake, is spending a
few days in Houston, registered
at the Macatee hotel. Mr. Raezer
has been engaged during the
past three months in prepara-
tions to carry out a big rice grow-
ing plan about seventy-one miles
from Tampico, Mexico, and has
shipped a number of carloads of
machinery from Houston to use
in equipping the rice mill and
the irrigation system.

"I am arranging to cultivate
6600 acres in rice. I will be able
to irrigate without pumping, as
I have a gravity flow of 78,000
gallons a minute, the stream
coming right out of the side of a
mountain. In that country a
planter can raise two crops of
rice a year, one from the planting
and one from the stubble. The
temperature has never gone low-
er than 56 degrees nor higher
than 94 degrees. Jose Rodri-
guez Cabo, one of the wealthiest
Mexicans in Mexico City, will be
associated with me in this enter-
prise. He is a member of the
Madero administration, being
chairman of the claims commis-
sion growing out of the late rev-
olution. He is a progressive man
and attained some notoriety by
reason of the fact that at the last
Dallas State fair he was the large-
est purchaser of Percheron stal-
lions and fancy Durham cattle.
We are preparing also to erect at
Las Palmas an American rice
mill, the first to be established in
the republic of Mexico. The
products of our plantation and
mill have already been contract-

ed for by merchants in Vera
Cruz, Tampico and Mexico City.
I have no idea but that rice can
be grown with greater profit
there than in Texas. From the
land which we are putting in rice
we are getting an abundance of
limes, grape fruit and other trop-
ical fruits. The revenue from
this source will not be inconsid-
erable."

Mr. Raezer was formerly own-
er of the Lakeside irrigation com-
pany of, Eagle Lake, one of the
largest concerns of its kind in
the South. —Houston Post.

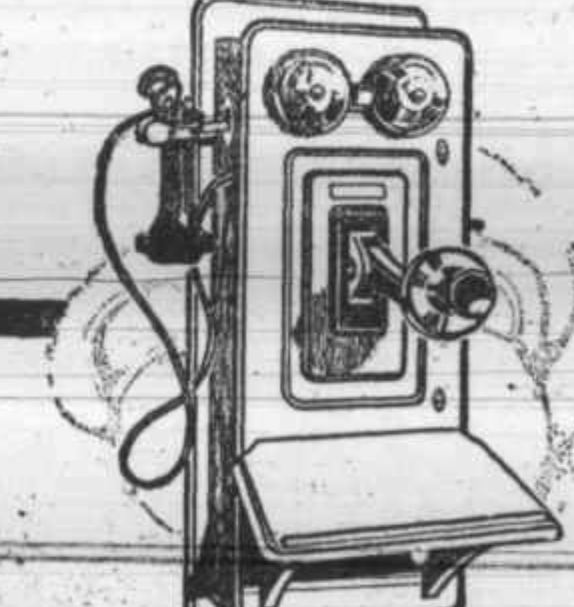
