HERBERT REESE KILLED.

Accidental Discharge of Pistol Ends Own Life at Columbus.

At his home in Columbus about three o'clock Tuesday afternoon, Herbert (S. H.) Reese, son of former sheriff Sam H. Reese, in some manner knocked a pistol from the top of a dresser, the accidental discharge of which caused his death. The pistol was a .32 Colt's automatic, supposed to be accident proof, but when it struck the floor it fired. The bullet struck the right leg just above the knee, inflicting a slight flesh wound in the right leg. From there it ranged through the testicle, on up through the groin and lodged somewhere near the upper part of the left hip. Despite the great shock, the fact that the bullet was steel lined gave some hope for his recovery. A message of Houston was telegraphed for the purpose of performing an operation, but before the team arrive on the night train, Herbert died, having passed away at two o'clock Wednesday morning. He was buried in Weimar yesterday afternoon by the side of his father.

Herbert Reese was thirty years of age, and a native of this county, and was well known here. Besides his wife, he is survived by his mother, Mrs. S. H. Reese, his brother, Walter Reese of El Paso, three sisters, Mrs. J. F. Lessing of Columbus, Mrs. Jas. Johnson of Austin and Miss Lillie Reese of Columbus.

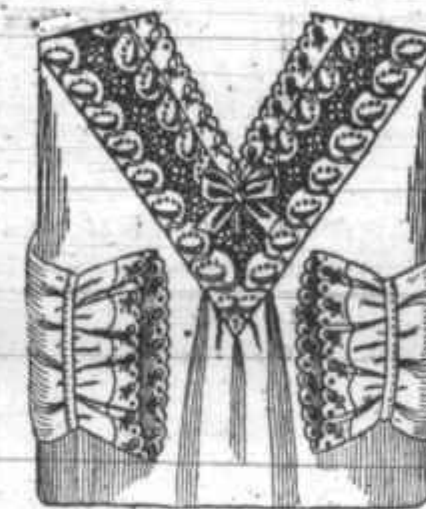
