WILSON CLUB ORGANIZED

Supporters of Woodrow Wilson Organize Club at Columbus.

In response to the call as published in the Citizen last week, a large number of the supporters of Gov. Woodrow Wilson met in the court house Wednesday for the purpose of organizing a Wilson Club. The meeting was called to order by Judge Kennon, who stated the object of the meeting. Judge Kennon announced that the next board train was a few minutes late, and that he desired before his departure to hear from those who had responded to the call.

Mr. Atkinson, district attorney of this district, Mr. Atkinson eloquently responded, and paid a most beautiful tribute to Gov. Wilson. Upon motion, Hon. John Hagedt was elected President, R. O. Goldsmith, Secretary, and Julius Sandmeyer, assistant Secretary of the club.

Upon motion Judge Kennon was requested to address the meeting further, and in the most clear and explicit language, set forth cogent reason for the nomination of Gov. Wilson for the presidency by the democratic party. Judge Kennon then introduced the following resolutions, which were unanimously adopted:

Be it resolved by the Woodrow Wilson Club of Columbus Texas:

1st. The sole object of the formation of the Club is to endeavor to aid in the nomination of Gov. Wilson for the presidency of the United States, and we invite all democrats of the town and precinct to join our organization, without regard to whom they prefer for other offices.

2nd. This Club, as an organization, shall make no effort to help or hinder any other candidate, national, state, or county.

3rd. We respectfully suggest to the Wilson supporters of other communities of the county, that they organize Wilson Democratic clubs in their respective localities, so that the true will of the democrats of the county may be expressed at the State convention, should there be no primary for the purpose of expressing the preference of the democrats of Texas as to who shall be the nominee.

Upon motion, president Hagedt appointed the following committee on rules: C. R. Grobe, Lester Holt, J. R. Wooten, W. S. Miller, Kenneth Brandon, Judge M. Kennon, J. J. Mansfield.

Upon motion of C. R. Grobe, it was decided to hold regular meetings of the Club on each Saturday at 2 o'clock p. m., the next meeting to be held on Saturday, March 16th. Every member present was requested to procure additional members, and the local, and daily papers were requested to publish the proceedings, after which the meeting adjourned.
