HOME BURNED TO GROUND

W. B. Hale's Home Destroyed by Fire on Monday Afternoon.

The fire alarm was given about half past one o'clock Monday afternoon, the fire being at the home of Mr. W. B. Hale about a half mile west of town near the curve on the San Antonio and Arkansas Pass railroad. The fire company responded promptly but did not take the hose carts as there are no water mains that far out and on this account and

no telephones near and so much time was consumed in getting the fire alarm to town that the fire was too well under way when the firemen arrived to be any service. The house was completely destroyed. The house was the property of Mr. G. W. Keith. It was valued at about \$700, with insurance to the amount of \$400. No one was in the house at the time and the origin of the fire is not known. Only a few articles of furniture were saved by some of the neighbors who were the first to reach the fire. Mr. Hale carried \$250 insurance on the furniture.
