Election Proclamation.

By virtue of the authority
vested in me as Mayor, and in
obedience to the order of the
city council, made and entered at
a regular meeting held on the
5th day of March, 1912, I do
hereby order and proclaim that
there will be held within the
municipal limits of the city of
Eagle Lake, on the first Tuesday
in April, 1912, a municipal elec-
tion for the purpose of electing a
mayor for the ensuing term, to
succeed W. S. Strickland, whose
term of office will have expired
by said date.

Also to elect a city marshal for
the ensuing term, to succeed H.
S. Vineyard, whose term of office
will have expired by said date.

Also to elect two aldermen for
the ensuing term to succeed E.
W. Hanly and W. E. Lenhart,
whose terms of office will have
expired by said date.

Said election to be held in the
city hall or on the band stand,
on the first Tuesday in April,

the same being the second day of
said month, and in accordance
with the laws of the State of
Texas, and the ordinances of the
city of Eagle Lake, regulating
such matters.

T. J. Roberts is hereby ap-
pointed judge of said election,
with authority to appoint his as-
sistant judges and clerks.

the 6th day of March, A. D. 1912.
