COLUMBUS PEOPLE ARE DELIGHTED WITH EAGLE LAKE'S HIGH SCHOOL.

One Hundred and Thirty Columbus People Came On Special Train to Inspect Our Schools.

Never in the history of Eagle Lake has there occurred an incident of more importance to the citizens of Colorado county than that of last Monday when the patrons, trustees, teachers and students of Columbus chartered a special train and came to visit and inspect our school.

Every effort was made to show our appreciation of the compliment paid us, and to cultivate the feeling of a united people of Colorado county.

Upon their arrival they were met by automobiles and carried to the school building, where they were assembled in our gymnasium and formally welcomed by Mr. J. H. Morgan, Superintendent J. H. Morgan.

After post cards of our building, auditorium, kitchen, work shop and laboratory had been handed out as souvenirs, they were shown through the various departments. In the hall on the first floor were arranged the general equipment and class work of the different rooms.

The rapia work, basket weaving, drawings, note books, papers, etc., attracted much attention and caused such favorable comment that it has been decided to have an exhibit of our school work at the Dallas and San Antonio fairs.

The kitchen proved to be the most popular resort for the even-

ing. The pure white tables, the neat gas stoves, the pretty girls, the delicate aroma of the food being prepared was more than even Mayor Strickland could bear to leave until served with a portion of the food prepared.

The laboratory with its complete equipment held the attention of those who were interested in the work being done along scientific lines, while the gas plant which supplies the kitchen, laboratory and other parts of the basement with fuel and light was closely inspected by those interested in having a plant that will furnish the equal of any city in the lower south.

The ladies of the city had prepared four thousand sandwiches, pickles and ample fruit punch which they served throughout the evening. We leave it to our guests to say whether they enjoyed themselves, but for Eagle Lake it can be said that we were very much pleased, and that the pride and interest in our own school has been increased manifold. Wharton, Tex., March 29.—Late reports from the lower part of Wharton County and Matagorda County say the Irish potato crop was badly damaged by the frost last week. This is accounted for by reason of the fact that no rain fell in the lower part of this country nor in Matagorda County, as it did in other sections. Corn is so badly injured that the entire crop had to be replanted.

Wharton, Tex., March 29.—The \$100,000 bonds that were voted by Precinct No. 1 for road improvements have been turned over to the Attorney General for approval. The City Council has ordered an election for the issuance of \$1,500,000 bonds for the extension of the sewer system. There seems to be no opposition to the movement and it is believed it will carry unanimously.

Weimar, Texas, March 29.—The Catholic people of this city and vicinity have accepted plans and the contract will soon be let for a new church edifice costing between \$80,000 and \$85,000. The building will be of brick, with white stone trimmings, on a foundation of reinforced concrete. The main structure will be 60 feet by 144, with a height of 145 to top of tower. The roof will be of slate and the ceiling vaulted gothic. Under the sanctuary will be a basement for the installation of a heating plant. It will be one of the most ornate church edifices in South Texas.

Messrs. Darby & Reed this year have five acres planted to potatoes on prairie land near Nottawa. Last year they put in a small patch which produced a fine yield.
